PASTOR'S NOTES

Doubting Thomas - a spiritual note

Today's Gospel story about Thomas has many thoughtful points of reflection. One that should not be overlooked is that Thomas was not present with his fellow disciples on the first day of the week (Sunday) when Christ appeared to his disciples. It was only on the next first day of the week (Sunday), when Thomas was present, that he came to believe in the Risen Lord.

Being gathered as disciples on Sunday (the first day of the week) is a time when Christ comes and shows us both his wounds of sacrifice (death) and his wounds of victory (resurrection), which enables us to declare – *My Lord and my God!* Christ calls those people blessed who have not physically seen his hands and his side but yet believe.

In essence Christ calls us blessed! Going to Sunday Mass (the first day of the week) is a blessed event, an encounter with the Risen Lord! As Vatican II teaches 'it is the source and summit of Christian life and living'.

When one examines this text [John 20:24-29] Christ knows what Thomas declared when other disciples had told him that 'they had seen the Lord' and Thomas' had been absent. For Christ there is more than doubt going on in Thomas. For Christ, Thomas seems to be verging on unbelief in that Thomas sets the criteria for believing or not believing.

When Christ encounters Thomas on that 'second Sunday', instead of Thomas probing Christ, Christ probes Thomas (and us) about not persisting in unbelief. The physical world of probing (needing scientific verification) is insufficient when it comes to the world of faith and belief. In the world of faith and belief one comes 'to know' through the testimony of others and the mystery of one's own dialogue, encounter and journey with the living God. Thomas has had a life with the Lord, which included those disciples who had testified to him. Thomas' response to Christ's 'spiritual probing' is to declare - My Lord and my God'. Thomas, who was on the cusp of unbelief, makes the deepest expression of faith uttered by any disciple in the gospels.

Hopefully we, like Thomas, make such a declaration when we encounter the Lord each Sunday at the Eucharist where he feeds us with his Body and Blood.

Divine Mercy Sunday

This Sunday (April 9th) is <u>Divine Mercy Sunday</u>. This particular devotion comes out of the life of a Polish nun, Sr. Faustina. On February 22, 1931 she had a vision of Jesus with two (2) rays of mercy streaming from around the area of his heart. He told her to have an image painted to represent this vision and to sign it, 'Jesus, I trust in you'. The pale ray stands for 'the water that makes souls righteous and the red ray stands for the blood which is the life of souls'. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to promote devotion to God's mercy so that all could find shelter in his merciful love.

There are a number of aspects to this devotion particularly the daily prayer of the chaplet of divine mercy using the beads of the rosary to recite certain prayers associated with God's mercy in place of the regular 'Our Fathers' and 'Hail Marys'. It is encouraged to recite this chaplet around the 3 p.m. hour when Christ died on the Cross displaying God's infinite mercy to the world. Other aspects of this devotion include the regular celebration of the great sacraments of God's mercy – Reconciliation and Eucharist, doing the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, etc.
