PASTOR'S NOTES

The Good Shepherd

Always on the fourth Sunday of the Easter season the Gospel readings are taken from the tenth chapter of John's Gospel where Christ speaks of himself as the Good Shepherd.

For the people of Israel God is their principal shepherd, though God is seldom labeled by that title. Yet the image of shepherding does describe the relationship between God and His people. Good shepherding implies being both leader and companion. At times God entrusts to his servants the sheep he leads (e.g. - Moses, David, etc.)

A truly good shepherd is one who sees to the fact that his sheep have enough food and water. He is the one who guards his sheep from the prey of wild animals and thieves. A good shepherd is especially concerned about the condition of his flock being careful not to overdrive them or to carry helpless lambs in his arms or on his shoulders. At night time a shepherd corrals his sheep in an enclosure like a cave or a temporary walled enclosure of tangled wood. **Ultimately the work of a shepherd is to keep his flock intact.** He does this by counting them as they pass under his hand as they go in and out of their enclosures and calls them by name. This idyllic kind of shepherding imagery is often used in describing how national leaders should rule over their people. But chapter 34 in the book of the prophet Ezekiel speaks harshly of bad shepherds whose rule is only to take advantage of their people for the leader's personal well-being. That is why Israel only saw God as their true shepherd and the prophets foresaw a day when God himself would shepherd His people.

This seems to be Jesus' concern in today's Gospel and is the reason he discloses himself to be the Good Shepherd. His love is for all and goes to the point where he lays down his life for his sheep because of the intimacy of his love for them (us). This Good Shepherd imagery is a very apt description of the Easter mystery and the mission of God's undying love to redeem the human race. The Good Shepherd is just another lens through which we see what it means to belong to the people of the resurrection.

After this Sunday the Gospel readings for the last couple weeks of the Easter season will find us at the Last Supper table listening to Jesus talk about the true vine and loving one another as he has loved us. The depth and profundity of Easter love is without parallel in all of history.
