# **PASTOR'S NOTES**

## **Confirmation/Eucharist** – an understanding

Yesterday [April 22<sup>nd</sup>] at a 10 a.m. Mass twenty-one (21) of our young parishioners from St. Thomas and St. Leo's parishes marked their full initiation into life with Christ and His Church. They celebrated both the sacraments of Confirmation and received Holy Communion (Eucharist) for their first time.

At that first Pentecost the risen and ascended Christ returned in the power and person of the Holy Spirit and forever changed not only the lives of his apostles (e.g. - the fisherman Peter did not die as a fisherman at the sea of Galilee, but as Christ's missionary in Rome being crucified upside down on a cross and buried in a place called the Vatican gardens), but also the lives of all who believe in Christ Jesus. The Church teaches that in **Confirmation** the Holy Spirit of Pentecost deepens the gifts which were bestowed in the waters of our baptisms. It was at Baptism that God took up residence in our lives. Now these seven (7) gifts of the Holy Spirit [knowledge, wisdom, understanding, counsel, piety, fortitude and fear of the Lord] are deepened within us to fashion us, like Peter of old, to become ambassadors for Christ in our world.

By the **gift of knowledge** we begin to see life as God sees it. The **gift of wisdom** assists us applying this knowledge in living holy lives. The **gift of understanding** helps us grasp the deep mysteries of faith and navigate the paradoxes/conundrums of daily life. The **gift of counsel** informs our consciences in making right judgements and choosing correct actions. The **gift of piety** inspires us to pray, to seek the graces of the sacraments and to learn from the lives of the saints. The **gift of fortitude** gives us courage to remain faithful to God in the face of temptation and the lure of evil. The **gift of the fear of the Lord** fills us with awe as we glory in nothing but friendship with God and his gift of salvation. Isaiah prophesied these very gifts of the Holy Spirit upon that descendent of King David who would usher in the time of salvation [Is. 11:1-9]. Christians have always understood this descendent to be Jesus Christ.

Like all life this new life in Christ needs to be constantly nourished by the risen life of Christ. Such is the gift of **Eucharist** - the Body and Blood of Christ. At his last supper on earth Christ took the bread and wine of the Jewish Passover meal and declared it to be his body and blood and then invited his apostles and us - 'Do this in memory of me'! At that same last supper Christ promises to send the Holy Spirit who would be with us always and instruct us in everything and remind us of all Christ told us.

With the reception of these two sacraments our young students have become fully initiated into the life of the Church. To be fully initiated into the life of the Church means to be more deeply rooted in the life of faith that cries out *Abba, Father*, to live a deeper bond with the Church, and to possess the strength to both spread and defend the faith by boldly proclaiming Christ and to never being ashamed of the Cross [CCC 1301].

With this understanding in mind let us join our confirmands in rightful joy and congratulations as new and fully initiated members of the Catholic Church:
