# The second semester of Advent . . .

On this Sunday [December 17<sup>th</sup>] we begin the second part of Advent where our attention becomes focused on the one who will fulfill the hope that has been engendered in Advent's first part. This second part of Advent focuses on the seven (7) attributes of the one whose coming will change the course of human history! The song – <u>O Come, O Come, Emmanuel</u> – proclaims these 7 attributes. This song is characterized by its 'O' antiphons. The origin of this song goes back to an anonymous monk of the 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> century, who was seeking to deepen his preparation for the great solemnity of Christmas and especially the person of Jesus, the Messiah.

The 'O' antiphons are composed of seven poetic verses each of which describes in greater detail what it means for Jesus to be our Savior. The antiphon that introduces the Gospel for each day beginning December 17<sup>th</sup> proclaims one of these seven 'O' antiphons.

The traditional order of the seven 'O' antiphons describe Christ as: *Wisdom, Lord of Might, Rod of Jesse, Key of David, Radiant Dawn, King of Nations and Emmanuel {'God with us'}.* There is an interesting note to this ordering of the seven 'O' antiphons when they are translated into Latin. The Latin translation for each of the above antiphons are: Sapientia, Adonai, Radix, Clavix, Oriens, Rex and Emmanuel. If you take the first letter from each of these Latin words and reverse them they spell out the phrase — <u>*ERO CRAS*</u> — which translates **"Tomorrow I shall be there"**.

After seven days of proclaiming the great attributes of Christ and asking him to come in the 'O' antiphons, it seems so fitting that ERO CRAS comes to fulfillment in the Christmas feast. In these last days of this Advent season may the seven 'O' antiphons lead our meditations on the one who comes at Christmas – *Wisdom from* <u>on high; Saving Lord; Flower of Jesse' stump; Key to heaven; Dayspring who puts death to flight; King who is</u> <u>Prince of Peace; Emmanuel ['God with us</u>'].

#### This week's Stewardship moment:

"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." ~ 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.
