PASTOR'S NOTES

A Lenten spiritual note —

On Ash Wednesday our Gospel reading from Matthew's Gospel had Jesus telling us about the three (3) spiritual practices of prayer, almsgiving and fasting. If done well, these three practices go a long way in perfecting our spiritual lives and put us in communion with God. **Prayer** puts us in conversation with God; **Almsgiving** leads us to care of others and **Fasting** disciplines harmful bodily desires and curtails the deleterious effects of vices, especially the capital sins. In that sense Lent could be a great season to fast from the capital sins.

Fasting from pride — some notes

First off, what is the difference between rightful self-esteem and sinful pride? The Catechism of the Catholic Church speaks of pride as the excessive esteem of self, or an exaggerated estimate of one's abilities, or the refusal to be satisfied with one's limitations. Of course the opposite of this would be humility or rightful self-esteem.

In essence pride is a lie because it causes us to overestimate our abilities, exaggerate our achievements, or inflate our importance. Pride allows us to live in a world of fantasy where we overlook blind spots and obstacles, ignore the obvious and focus only on what we want to see or hear.

More subtly pride does not listen to what others are saying because we want to express our ideas, or we 'fish' for compliments on our dress or our youthfulness, seek praise and first place, attribute achievements to personal powers, blame moral lapses on things beyond one's control, ignore or embellish humble backgrounds, take credit for more than what is fair, dress well or arrive late so as to be noticed or become the center of attention, neglect to say 'thanks' by not acknowledging the love and kindness behind the gift, etc.

Ultimately pride leads to alienation much like the consequence of the pride that went into building the Tower of Babel [Gen. 11:1-9]. People were scattered and ended up not being able to speak to one another. 'Blocking out' or 'walling off other people' is often another tell tale sign of pride – much like the older son in the Prodigal Son story [Lk. 15:11-31]. This, in turn, can take the joy out of living and generate an unhealthy attitude of independence – ultimately denying our dependence upon God!

Perhaps some ways of conquering pride: practice humility by a realistic appraisal of one's talents and flaws; accepting and valuing the talents and accomplishments of others; looking for and acknowledging the good qualities in others; asking advice of others; doing jobs others do not want; etc.

A saintly Lenten thought -

"Recognize to whom you owe the fact that you exist, that you breathe, that you understand, that you are wise ... What benefactor has enabled you to look upon the beauty of the sky, the sun in its course, the circle of the moon ... Who has blessed you with rain, with different kinds of food, with the arts ... Who has given you dominion over animals ... Who has made you lord and master of everything on earth? ... Is it not God who asks you now in turn to show yourself generous ... Because we have received from him so many wonderful gifts, will we not be ashamed to refuse him this one thing only, our generosity?"
