Fasting from envy — *some notes*

Fasting is a lenten discipline that is meant to be an antidote from harmful bodily desires and most importantly curtail the deleterious effects of vices. Certainly the seven (7) capital sins would be vices to be avoided at all costs. In that sense Lent could be a great season to begin a life-long fast from the capital sins. In this second lenten reflection – let us examine the capital sin of envy.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines envy as *"the sadness at the sight of another's goods and the immoderate desire to acquire them for oneself, even unjustly.* [CCC 2539]

Envy is often cloaked under the guise of trying to be the best version of oneself, of trying to better oneself by emulating the good traits found in other people. Bettering oneself is a good and **true self-love comes from knowing both one's gifts and one's limitations** all the while honoring a healthy respect and appreciation of other people's talents and gifts.

Envy begins to emerge when we become focused on others and desiring that person's goods, gifts and talents for oneself. Left unchecked envy begins to create a sense of dejection, anger, bitterness, resentfulness, critical, becoming cross and irritable at the good fortune of another person. As the downward spiral continues a person begins to rejoice at the other person's misfortunes and sometimes cares less about getting someone's gift(s) just so long as the other person is deprived of that gift. In all of this a person begins to think less of themself and sees oneself as deficient and inferior (e.g. - getting passed over for a promotion). A blindness sets in and produces a wall between God and oneself, even coming to believe God has robbed us. Scripture has a number of high profile stories of envy (e.g. - **Cain's envy of Abel's gifts** to God in Genesis 4. Rather than focusing on how to make his gifts better, Cain kills his brother Abel; the story of **King David and his affair with Bathsheba** where David has Bathsheba's husband killed because of his envious desire to have Bathsheba as his own wife [2 Samuel 11]. St. Augustine saw envy as "the diabolical sin" and St. Gregory the Great saw envy as giving birth to "*hatred, detraction, calumny, joy caused by the misfortune of a neighbor and displeasure caused by his prosperity*" [CCC 2539].

<u>The opposite of envy</u> is charity where we rejoice in the success of others, speak well of others, and sincerely compliment others. Truly fasting from envy would be a worthy practice to begin this Lent and continue for a life time.

Chimbote, Peru - coming to St. Leo's

This coming Wednesday evening, February 28th, at 7 p.m. Todd Mikkelson will give an half hour presentation on the mission work being done in Chimbote, Peru. This talk will be given in the Spirit of Life Center and is open to all parishioners.

Almost 50 years ago Fr. Jack Davis, a Fargo diocesan priest from Devils Lake, began mission work in Chimbote, Peru. Since that time numerous parishes in the Diocese of Fargo have contributed to this missionary effort. Hundreds of people from the Diocese have made mission trips to Chimbote. The lives of hundreds of thousands of people have been touched by the generous care and concern of people who support what is now known as *Friends of Chimbote*. Each year the children's Sunday Offertory collection is given to support the mission work of the *Friends of Chimbote*. We are especially inviting our 8th to 12th grade students to attend this presentation and see what their church support is doing in helping some of the world's poorest people. It would be great to have the parents of our 8th to 12th grade students attend this short talk. If anyone might be interested in making a mission trip to Chimbote, this would be a great event to attend and get some valuable information on such an endeavor.
