PASTOR'S NOTES

Ecumenism - God's will and our prayer

Each year in January [between January 18th and January 25th] the Church celebrates the <u>Week of Prayer</u> for Christian Unity.

Two great splits have happened in the history of Christianity. One took place in the 1000s when Christian churches split between the East and the West. Those Eastern churches are today collectively known as the Orthodox churches. In the 1500s Western Christianity suffered a rupture that is commonly known as the Reformation. Out of that age has come a number of denominations that are collectively known as Protestant churches.

Both of these divisions within Christianity go against the very will of Christ, who at the Last Supper on the night before he died, prayed 'that all may be one as he and the Father are one'. [Jn. 17:21]

In the early 1900s an Episcopalian priest, Fr. Paul Wattson, who later became Catholic, began what has come to be known as the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity*. He chose the dates between January 18th and January 25th as eight (8) days *(an octave)* of prayer for Christians unity. At that time January 18th celebrated the Chair of St. Peter (the primacy of the Pope) and January 25th celebrates the conversion of St. Paul and his mission to convert the Gentile world to Christianity.

The Vatican II (1962-65) document - <u>The Decree on Ecumenism</u> - begins with this statement, "The restoration of unity among all Christians is one of the principal concerns of the Second Vatican Council."

In 1995 the late Pope John Paul II wrote an encyclical letter on ecumenism - <u>Ut Unum Sint</u> (That All May be One) - and states within it, "At the Second Vatican Council, the Catholic Church committed herself irrevocably to following the path of the ecumenical venture ..." {3}, and exhorts, "all the Catholic faithful to recognize the signs of the times and to participate actively in the work of ecumenism." {8} He goes on to say, "... ecumenism, the movement promoting Christian unity, is not some sort of "appendix" (to church life). Rather ecumenism is an organic part of her life and work ..." {20} — "Along the ecumenical path to unity, pride of place certainly belongs to common prayer ..." {22} — "It is a source of joy to see that many ecumenical meetings almost always include and indeed culminate in prayer. The <u>Week of Prayer for Christian Unity</u>, celebrated in January ... has become a widespread and well established tradition." {24}

It is in this spirit that the Casselton Area Ministerium Association hosts an ecumenical service of prayer and song during the *Week of Prayer for Christian Unity* to foster prayer for the restoration of Christian unity.

This year's celebration will be held on **Wednesday**, **January 24**th at 6:45 p.m. at St. Leo's Catholic Church. The prayer service will be followed by a coffee and dessert social in the Spirit of Life Center. Please join us in prayer as we do our part in the restoration of Christian unity.

Parents — Your Children's Envelopes

As part of our parish stewardship strategy every year we provide each RE student with a packet of Sunday Offertory envelopes to help them get into the habit of regularly supporting their church. All the money raised through the student's Offertory envelopes is given to the charity known as *Friends of Chimbote*. This charity in Chimbote, Peru began out the missionary work of Fr. Jack Davis, who was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Fargo in 1969.

In 2016 children's envelopes gave \$1542 to Chimbote. This past year (2023) we only raised \$886. I believe we can do better. Parents — Please encourage your child(ren) to use their Sunday Offertory envelopes in support of this very worthy charity.

In the off chance your students forgets his/her Sunday envelope at home, there are supplemental student envelopes at the rear of the church for their use. Just have your student write their name on that supplemental envelope before putting it into the Offertory collection. Thank you for your support in this matter.
