PASTOR'S NOTES

World-wide Day of Grandparents & the Elderly -

On January 31, 2021 Pope Francis announced a new celebration for honoring all grandparents and the elderly — World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. It was to be celebrated every fourth Sunday of July. The fourth Sunday of July will always fall closest to July 26th, which is the memorial that honors Sts. Anne and Joachim – grandparents of Jesus. For us, this year's date falls on Sunday, July 23rd.

In our present times grandparents and the elderly can often get lost in the 'hustle and bustle' of life. But this year's theme comes from Luke 1:50 – "His mercy is from age to age". As Pope Francis reminds us, "Old age is not a time easily understood ... no one prepares us for old age, and at times it seems to take us by surprise ... we are tempted to ward off old age by hiding our wrinkles, and pretending to be forever young ... recognition that our strength is ebbing or the onset of sickness can undermine our certainties ... We can resonate with the heartfelt prayer of the Psalmist: 'Do not cast me off in the time of old age; forsake me not when my strength is spent' [71:9]."

Pope Francis writes about the vocation of grandparents and elderly. When Christ ascended to heaven he commissioned all of us to 'teach them to observe all that he commanded us'. In particular the vocation of grandparents and the elderly is "to preserve our roots, to pass on the faith to the young, and to care for the little ones. Think about it: what is our vocation today at our age? To preserve our roots, to pass on the faith to the young, and to care for the little ones. Never forget this."

He goes on to speak about the fact that "no one is saved alone." We are all indebted to one another. We are all brothers and sisters. We need to build fraternity and social friendships for the world tomorrow. Grandparents and the elderly are needed to build this edifice. Among the three pillars that grandparents and elderly bring to this enterprise are **dreams**, **memory and prayer**. <u>Dreams</u> of justice, of peace and solidarity make it possible for the young to have visions. Hard <u>memories</u> of war or immigration give birth to the hope of building a humane and welcoming world. The <u>prayer</u> of grandparents and the elderly is a precious resource and the deep breath of the Church that can protect the world. **Such is the gift of grandparents and the elderly!!!**
