PASTOR'S NOTES

Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - a reflection -

Today's solemnity of the <u>Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ</u> has a very deep history in the life of the Church.

Its present manifestation began with a vision to an Augustinian nun in 1209 in Liege, Belgium with the Lord desiring a feast celebrating the Eucharist within the Church's annual cycle of feasts. The bishop of Liege introduced such a feast in 1246 and by 1264 it was extended to the whole Church. It was originally titled <u>Festum Ss. Corporis Christi</u> [Feast of the Most Holy Body of Christ] and eventually became titled <u>Ss.mi Corporis et Sanguinis Christi Solemnitas</u> [Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ].

But the Church's deep reverence of the Eucharist certainly predates the 1200s. Today's Gospel reading deeply grounds church teaching on Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist when Christ himself says —"I will give my flesh for the life of the world... unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you... For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink..." [Jn 6:51, 53, 55]. St. Paul reaffirms this belief about Christ's Body and Blood in today's second reading [1 Cor. 10:16-17].

Such foundational teaching led St. Cyril, bishop of Jerusalem, in the 300s to write a series of catechetical lessons about the Eucharist:

"In approaching the (Eucharist) make thy left hand a throne for the right as for that which is to receive a King. And having hollowed thy palm receive the Body of Christ, saying over it, Amen ... Then after thou hast partaken of the Body of Christ draw near also to the Cup of His Blood ... and saying with an air of worship and reverence, Amen ..."

St. Albert the Great [1206-1280], a German Dominican priest who taught St. Thomas Aquinas, once offered these words as he reflected on the Gospel account of Jesus' command --- 'do this in remembrance of me' — after he had blessed the bread and wine and declared it to be body and blood [Lk. 22:19-20] ---

"Certainly he would demand nothing more profitable, nothing more pleasant, nothing more beneficial, nothing more desirable, nothing more similar to eternal life ...

This sacrament is profitable because it grants remission of sins; it is most useful because it bestows the fullness of grace on us in this life...

Nor can we do anything more pleasant. For what is better than God manifesting his whole sweetness to us...

He could not have commanded anything more beneficial, for this sacrament is the fruit of the tree of life. Anyone who receives this sacrament with the devotion of sincere faith will never taste death...

Nor could he have commanded anything more loveable, for this sacrament produces love and union. It is characteristic of the greatest love to give itself as food... I have loved them and they have loved me so much that I desire to be within them, and they wish to receive me so they may become my members. There is no more intimate or more natural means for them to be united to me, and I to them.

Nor could he have commanded anything which is more like eternal life."

Such is the glory and splendor of this day!

God's Gift Appeal Update — St. Leo's 2023 God's Gift Appeal goal is \$56,112

As of date:

78 of 262 St. Leo's parish households (30%) have pledged \$39,077 towards our goal of \$56,112, which is 70% of our goal. St. Leo's Finance Council established a goal of having 45% parish household participation for 2023. We last achieved that rate of participation in 2015 when our household participation rate was 46%.

By way of comparison, two parishes of St. Leo's size [Harvey {247 households} and Napoleon {267 households}] presently have a household participation rate of 44%. In order for St. Leo's to rise to that level of participation we would need 37 more households to contribute to this year's God's Gift Appeal. Could you help???
