On **Saturday, June 3rd at 10 a.m.** Deacon Matt Kensok is scheduled to be ordained to the priesthood for the Diocese of Fargo at St. Mary's Cathedral parish in Fargo. He will be the only priest ordained this year for the Diocese of Fargo. Since he is a native son of St. Leo's parish in Casselton we are hoping St. Leo's and St. Thomas parishioners will fill the Cathedral for that celebration. Many people have never attended an ordination liturgy. This would be a great opportunity for both young and old to be part of that special event.

On Sunday, June 4th at the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass, Father Matt Kensok will celebrate his first Mass as a priest here at St. Leo's parish. His first Mass will be followed by a nice meal in St. Leo's Spirit of Life Center served by St. Leo's Knights of Columbus Council. We are hoping you can join us for both Fr. Kensok's First Mass and the celebration that follows.

Further details will be forthcoming, but we wanted to make sure that you got these two events on your calendar. Having a priest ordained from one's parish is a very big deal! It should bring a lot of pride for us to have one of our own ordained to serve the many people of eastern North Dakota for (hopefully) many years to come. His priesthood will be a great blessing to the many who will be richly served by Fr. Matt's celebrations of baptismal life, of daily gifting people with the Lord's Body and Blood, of bestowing God's merciful love in the sacrament of Reconciliation, of preparing and witnessing the pledge of married love, of anointing and being present to those touched by disease, illness, or impending death. Beyond that, there will be the many teaching occasions about moral and spiritual matters, daily prayer for oneself and the people he serves, counseling and spiritual advising our call to holiness, etc. Such is the threshold that Deacon Matt will cross on June 3rd of this year.

Lent - taking stock

With this Sunday there are 11 days remaining in this year's Lenten season until we enter the Easter Triduum of **Holy Thursday, Good Friday** and the **Easter Vigil** on Holy Saturday. Lent began with the mark of ashes and a call for prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Lent is a time to rise from ashes by a more intense turning to God {prayer}, a more intentional outreach to others {almsgiving}, a more willful discipline of vices and disordered passions {fasting}. Some thoughts to help us reach Easter on a high note:

In terms of prayer:

- (1) you are invited to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation here at St. Leo's on Friday, March 31st at 7 p.m.. There will be six priests to help celebrate this gracious gift of God's reconciling love and mercy;
- (2) plan on making Holy Week special by attending the many services of that week

In terms of fasting:

- (1) 'double down' on whatever personal sacrifice or thing you gave up for Lent;
- (2) remember this coming Friday [March 31st] is a day of abstaining from meat and next Friday (Good Friday April 7th) is a day of both abstinence and fasting [eating only two small meals or simply the loaf of bread given out on Holy Thursday evening].

In terms of almsgiving:

- (1) be generous with your Lenten canisters or Lenten envelope;
- (2) continue to enter more fully into becoming a tithing household in terms of both Sunday Offertory giving and the diocesan God's Gift Appeal.
