#### **PASTOR'S NOTES**

#### The <u>Ascension</u> — no small mystery of faith!

The Acts of the Apostles tells us that after Christ's Resurrection from the tomb he appeared to his disciples "over the course of 40 days" and spoke to them about the reign of God. Then he ascended into heaven. **This 40<sup>th</sup> day become known as Ascension Thursday** and for centuries was a holy day of obligation in the Catholic Church. A number of years ago most diocesan bishops in the United States moved this solemnity and holy day from Thursday to the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the Easter season. This was done to ensure that the mystery of the Ascension would be celebrated when a large number of the faithful gather in worship of God. Since the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter (which is actually the 43<sup>rd</sup> day of the Easter season) was the closest to this 40<sup>th</sup> day after Easter, the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter was replaced with the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord.

# Therefore, we have today's celebration - the Ascension of the Lord.

#### What is the significance of the Lord's ascension into heaven??

- <u>First and foremost</u> it celebrates the 're-opening' of access to God's life and happiness. Access to heaven had been closed since the sin of our first parents in the Garden of Eden. When God expelled them from the garden of Eden, God "stationed the cherubim and the fiery revolving sword, to guard the way to the tree of life." [Gen. 5:24]
- <u>Furthermore</u> with Christ's Ascension the old regime has passed away and a new one has come to pass. What is radically new is that in Christ's Ascension, he now sits **bodily** at the Father's right hand because the Son became incarnate (*took on human flesh*) and now the glorified flesh of his humanity is imbedded into the Godhead. When we rise and stand before the throne of God we shall see the human face of Christ.
- Also with Christ's Ascension he sits exalted in heavenly power. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches "There Christ permanently exercises his priesthood for he 'always lives to make intercession' for 'those who draw near to God through him' [Heb. 7:25]. As 'high priest of the good things yet to come' he is the center and principal actor of the liturgy that honors the Father in heaven" [Heb. 9:11]. [CCC 662]
- <u>Lastly</u>, Christ's Ascension to the Father's right hand inaugurates the Kingdom of God in history and fulfills the vision given to the prophet Daniel where the Son of Man is given a dominion which will not pass away nor be destroyed [Dan. 7:14]. As the Creed says, it is from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead.

# With all of this being said, the Ascension of the Lord gives focus and direction to our spiritual lives. It teaches:

- (a) we are a pilgrim people, simply sojourners in this land. Our real home is heaven. Do not get too attached to the things of this world. They are passing realities. As St. Paul reminds us, "We do not fix our gaze on what is seen but on what is unseen. What is seen is transitory; what is unseen lasts forever" [2 Cor. 4:18], and "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" [Philippians 3:20].
- (b) at the end of time, if we find ourselves counted among the saved, like Christ we, too, will receive glorified bodies and find ourselves at the throne of the Father. What we do now in our earthly flesh is of great consequence. If our flesh is to be glorified, we must now live in the flesh in ways that are in keeping with what our glorified existence will someday be.
- (c) as our patron saint, St. Leo the Great, so richly said when speaking about the Ascension, "And so our Redeemer's visible presence has passed into the sacraments." Christ has not abandoned us in the Ascension, but lives more fully in the sacraments of his Church.
