PASTOR'S NOTES

Pentecost – a promise come to fruition —

With the celebration of Pentecost the 50 day season of Easter season comes to a close. We often speak of Pentecost as the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Church. That is not quite true!! The Holy Spirit has been active in history from the beginning and has come full circle in this feast called **Pentecost**. Let us look at this ongoing presence of the Holy Spirit in history:

- > it was the presence of the Holy Spirit that hovered above the waters of creation and the bringing forth of life:
- > it was the presence of the Holy Spirit who invited Abraham to leave the Ur of the Chaldeans and gave promises of descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and land 'flowing with milk and honev':
- > it was the presence of the Holy Spirit in the clouded-shrouded Mt. Sinai and the giving of the Law;
- > it was the presence of the Holy Spirit who took up residence in the lives of the prophets who spoke about a promised Messiah, a suffering servant, a faithful remnant in spite of sin and corruption, dry bones coming to life, etc.;
- > it was the presence of the Holy Spirit who raised up John the Baptist and his message of repentance and 'preparing the way of the Lord';
- > it was the presence of the Holy Spirit who came upon the Blessed Virgin Mary, overshadowed her, and she conceived a son:
- > it was the presence of the Holy Spirit who led this son into the desert for forty days where he was tempted by the devil:
- > it was the presence of the Holy Spirit at the Last Supper where Christ promised to send an Advocate to his apostles at the Last Supper table so as to remind them and us of all that he said and did;

Christ gave up his spirit on Calvary [Mt. 27:50; Lk. 23:46; Jn. 19:30] only to release his risen Spirit at Pentecost to take up residence in His Church, the sacrament of salvation, and the seven sacraments of the Church.

All of history is caught up in the Holy Spirit! The Holy Spirit of the Risen Christ does not just act in the solemn acts of church councils and the Pope, but accompanies and is found in the many activities of the Church – Scripture, prayer, the charisms and ministries of the church, the witness of the saints, and as is often forgotten – in the constant activity of the Holy Spirit in the sacraments. As Pope St. Leo the Great was fond of saying 'all that Christ accomplished in history has now passed into the sacraments'. The risen Christ is truly present in every sacrament - his risen life in Baptism, his missionary spirit in Confirmation, his Body and Blood in the Eucharist as the food of spiritual lives, his healing power in the anointing of the sick, his forgiving love in reconciliation, his faithful love in marriage, and his shepherding spirit in Holy Orders.

Such is the glory of Pentecost!!
