That would include the higher price we paid for beef this year. We served a little over 500 people this year, which is about 60 less than last year. When all is said and done it looks like nearly 400 parishioners played their part in preparing & serving a great meal, buying/selling raffle tickets, supplying/providing — fine desserts, kids treats, country store goodies & crafts, silent auction items, etc.

A special thank you goes out to Delores Grommesh who once again organized and 'trail-bossed' our wonderful roast beef dinner and accoutrements. This is Delores' 12th year of heading up the Fall Dinner along with her able assistants. Our hats are off to Delores and her Dinner helpers!!! Besides their hard work nearly 400 parishioners stepped up to the plate in one way or another. Here is break-down of the 2023 Raffle & Fall Dinner workers by the numbers ----
