PASTOR'S NOTES

Fr. Al Bitz — faithful priest, mentor and very good friend

The funeral Mass for Fr. Al Bitz will be on Monday, November 27th at St. Philip Neri church in Napoleon, North Dakota. Fr. Bitz was pastor of both St. Leo's and St. Thomas from 1996 to 2003.

I first met Fr. Bitz in the summer of 1976 as a seminarian and he was the associate Pastor with Fr. Dick Rudd in Langdon. The following year (1977) he was associate Pastor with Fr. Bill Sherman at St. Michael's Church in Grand Forks. At that time I was assigned for my deacon internship at St. Michael's from August 1977 through January 1978. **It was a fantastic experience.** Fr. Bitz took me under his wings and 'taught me the ropes' of becoming a priest. Wherever he went, I went. I tagged along for funeral vigils, visiting the dying, doing hospital visits, teaching RE classes, leading high school groups, taking night calls for the hospital,

etc. I could not have had a better mentor!!

It was the start of a remarkable friendship over the last 46 years. After my ordination in June of 1978 I replaced Fr. Bitz at St. Michael's while he began his first pastorate at St. Anthony's in Fargo. Nineteen (19) years later I would become pastor of St. Anthony's and twelve (12) years after that I became Pastor of St. Leo's and St. Thomas where Fr. Bitz had been Pastor from 1996 to 2003. We shared a number of common assignments. To follow where he had been was always an easy task. His understanding of Church and pastoral ministry was 'second to none', especially his understanding of the Vatican II Council. He was well aware and well read of major church documents. On more than one occasion he would draw attention to what the document actually said and not some superficial read.

He stayed overnight on a number of occasions at both St. Anthony's and St. Leo's and we would engage in spirited discussions on church matters. Those were good and engaging moments and reflections about pastoral life in the church.

Fr. Bitz will be deeply missed and his insightful voice in the Diocese of Fargo will be a true loss for the many who have been touched by his pastoral care of God's people. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord ... and let perpetual light shine upon him.

Understanding Christ's Kingship

This Sunday's solemnity of *Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe* is a recent addition to the liturgical calendar of the Church. It was declared a solemnity on December 11, 1925 by Pope Pius XI. He prayed this solemnity would be an antidote to the rise of secularism and atheism of his day. It is meant to foster recognition of Christ's kingly rights over the hearts and minds of all human beings. Originally it was celebrated on the last Sunday of October, but after the Vatican II Council [1962-65], it was moved to the last Sunday of the church year. Here it more properly signifies Christ's rule over all things as well as establishes the goal of our earthly pilgrimage and the goal of human history.

But, the Lord's kingship is very different from most understandings of kingship. The 3-year Sunday cycle of Gospel readings for Christ the King Sunday present powerful insights into the way Christ's kingship is recognized:

In <u>Matthew's Gospel</u> [Mt. 25:31-46] (*this year's Sunday reading*) Christ as King is found in the least of his brothers and seeks the service of our active love;

- in **John's Gospel** [Jn. 18:33b-37] (next year's Sunday reading) Christ as King is a prisoner before Pilate telling him about Truth and that all power comes from God;
- in Luke's Gospel [Lk. 23:35-45] *(two years from now)* Christ as King hangs on the Cross and assures the good thief of his entry into paradise.

Such is Christ's Kingship!!


