"Cat" Sunday

Each Fall a Sunday is designated as *Catechetical Sunday* in the life of the Catholic Church in the United States of America. This day recognizes the invaluable service, which the Church receives from the ministry of our **catechists** *(teachers within Religious Education (RE) programs).*

Our parishes have truly been blessed by those who have volunteered to do their best in passing on the heritage of the Catholic faith to your sons and daughters. Without question parents are the first teachers of faith, but the glory of the Gospel and the mystery of the Church is an enterprise much larger than simply family life. Probing that glory and understanding that mystery involves the collaborative efforts of all parish members.

For those who 'step to the plate' and enter the classrooms of instruction as catechists, we give both formal recognition and grateful thanks on *Catechetical Sunday*. This weekly gift of instruction and preparation that goes into that instruction is no small gift. In that sense catechists represent the heart of the spiritual life – dying to self and living for others. Catechists are more than teachers. The best of catechists embody the truths they teach, and by their lives witness to the joy of knowing Christ and the beauty of the Catholic faith (by possess-ing) <u>faith</u> in Christ and the goodness of humanity, <u>hope</u> of eternal life, and <u>love</u> for all that good, right and holy. As the saying goes – 'faith is caught before it is taught'. May our catechists be so enlivened!

The theme of this year's Catechetical Sunday comes from Matthew's Gospel "*Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest*" [Mt.11:28]. RE programs fulfill this mandate by inviting parishioners to <u>'Come'</u>. In turn RE programs share the Gospel and the light and life of faith to <u>'all who are</u> <u>burdened'</u>. In doing thus, participants come to know <u>'the rest'</u> found in God alone. Such is the vision and hope of our RE programs at both St. Leo's and St. Thomas.

The prayer cards in the pews contain the names of our catechists and a prayer for them. Please take a prayer card home and in the course of this school year offer a prayer in gratitude for our catechists and their essential work in the life of the Church. Again our deepest thanks!

Church microphone & speaker system

Off and on over time people have noted some difficulties with St. Leo's church microphone and speaker system. Recently an audio specialist from Tricorne Audio in Fargo evaluated our system. He noted two things: **Firstly**, a couple of our microphones have been in a 'compressed mode' and is probably not serving us well. One of those microphones is the one the priest uses at the altar and the resider's bench and when preaching out front. That 'compression mode' has been turned off. **Secondly**, our speaker box that hangs from the ceiling is a very good speaker system and is comprised of three separate units. The 'tweeter speakers' in that upper third part of that speaker box system 'are blown' and need to be replaced. We are looking at completing that work in the early part of October. Hopefully these two things will greatly improve St. Leo's church's audio system.

<u>By way of note</u>: the audio specialist was able to analyze that 27-foot high speaker box system because of the hard work of Micah Bartholomay and his helpers - Jim Flynn and Jared Nelson. Micah rounded up the supplies and he and his helpers constructed a stand upon which the Central Cass scissor lift could be placed so as to access the speaker box.
