Who assists, cares for, helps??

the intellectually disabled?, ... vulnerable adults? ... children in foster care? when there is no family, or those unable to conceive? ... those with unplanned pregnancies? ... individuals, couples or families in need of faith-based counseling?

The answer to all of these questions is Catholic Charities North Dakota!

Catholic Charities North Dakota (CCND) is the Catholic Church's pastoral arm of mercy reaching out across the state of North Dakota. As you well know there are many wonderful organizations doing charitable work in helping people in their times of need. In many ways the work of CCND is not as well known as more publicized groups like shelters and food pantries because of the long term nature of their work, especially relationship skills. Presently the service work of Catholic Charities North Dakota is grouped under five (5) headings:

- 1) Guardianship services to over 500 vulnerable persons with *intellectual disabilities*. A guardian is a court-appointed person assigned to each of these persons who need support with decision-making to prevent abuse, neglect and exploitation. These services includes visits and attending meetings and appointments to insure each client's well-being. In addition CCND operates a 24 hour emergency/assistance line. In the state of North Dakota there is a waiting list of over 100 persons needing and waiting for these guardianship services.
- 2) Guardianship services for vulnerable adults. A more recent CCND service that provides the specialized service of being the decision maker for elderly persons with dementia/alzheimer's, individuals with mental health disorders, or persons with other vulnerabilities. These guardians navigate the complex world long-term care, financial assistance, Social Security, medical assistance, etc. Again these are court-appointed services. Presently there are over 100 persons being served by CCND with 20 waiting for services.
- 3) Adults Adopting Special Kids {AASK} works with finding permanent and stable "forever" homes for children in foster care. Over 700 kids received AASK services of home assessments, finalization and adoption placements. As with the Guardianship program there are many on waiting lists to receive care. These services are provided through a contract with the North Dakota Department of Health and Human Services. Since 2016 adoption services have included postadopt services (e.g. support groups, family camps, parent retreats, mentorship, etc.) for all families who have adopted in North Dakota.
- 4) Pregnancy, Parenting and Adoption Services (PPAS) help people who are unprepared for pregnancy to learn about options for parenting and adoption. In addition to those unprepared for pregnancy, there are couples who desire the gift of a child and seek the services of an adoption agency. CCND's adoption services deal with North Dakota infant adoptions, relative adoptions as well as out-of-state and international adoptions, and help with adoption searches and disclosures.
- **5)** Counseling services are for individuals, couples and families who are coping with crisis, stress and change in their lives. Last year CCND had over 1300 counseling sessions.

The work of Catholic Charities North Dakota touches a lot of homes who are in need of help and the tender mercy of God. Their kind of service often flies under the radar because it involves long term relationships and skills that do not lend themselves to 'quick fix' solutions. CCND works at healing and reconciling the 'woundedness' of the human condition and deserves our deepest appreciation. **Your support is deeply appreciated.**
