End of another church year

Next Sunday (Nov. 22<sup>nd</sup>) is the solemnity of *Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe*, which is often shortened to simply Christ the King Sunday. That solemnity is always the last Sunday of the church year. The following Sunday (Nov. 29<sup>th</sup>) will be the first Sunday of Advent and Advent is the season that begins a new church year.

Our Sunday gospel readings for this present church year that is soon ending have come from Matthew’s gospel. All gospels tell the story of Christ whom the Father sent into the world to save the human race. Each gospel develops this story in the unique ways that God has spoken to that particular gospel writer.

In many ways Matthew’s gospel can be summarized in chapters 5, 6 & 7. These three chapters are known as the *Sermon on the Mount*. This sermon begins with the Beatitudes, which outlines the stairway to heaven [Mt. 5:1-12]. This is followed by probing the deepest meaning of the Ten Commandments (e.g. - not calling one another names {5<sup>th</sup> Commandment}; adultery in the heart {6<sup>th</sup> Commandment}; praying for one’s enemies, etc.).

In chapter seven (7), Jesus ends the *Sermon on the Mount* with the images of two houses — one built on sand and other built on rock. He challenges all people **who listen to these words and puts them into practice** as being a person who has built his house on rock. Such houses can stand the falling rain and the buffeting winds whereas houses built on sand will collapse. **The following chapters in Matthew’s gospel spell out this house-building project.**

All readers are left to ponder and ask themselves — is my house of faith built on sand or is it built on rock?

- > have we interiorized the Ten Commandments or just lived them in the most minimal of ways? [Mt. 5:21ff.; 5:27ff.; 5:38-48, etc.]
- > do we see the Christian way of life as the ‘pearl of great price’ and sold everything to purchase it? [Mt. 13:44-46]
- > do we expect and accept great mercy from God but do not give to others in the same way? [Mt. 18:21-35]
- > do we desire all the perks and privileges of attending a wedding, but do not do our part in purchasing a wedding garment? [Mt. 22:1-14]
- > do we expect to get or to borrow spiritual gifts from others that can only be obtained by ourselves? [Mt. 25:1-13]

Hopefully this year’s walk with Matthew’s gospel has enriched our spiritual lives and called us to live more fully the ways of God’s Kingdom.
