PASTOR'S NOTES

Obligation? Privileged Opportunity!!

Last March 17, 2020 Bishop John Folda of the Diocese of Fargo issued a decree dispensing Catholics from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation due to the severity of the COVID -19 pandemic.

On May 1, 2021 Bishop Folda is lifting that dispensation and reinstating the general obligation for Catholics to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation because circumstances now allow us to attend Mass safely.

The upcoming May 1st decree has a typically few cases exempting persons from the obligation of attending Sunday/Holy Day Masses (e.g. - the ill, those confined to hospitals/nursing homes, recent exposure to COVID - 19 or other serious or contagious illness, etc.)

Attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation has always stood at the heart of faithful living by believers in Jesus Christ. Scriptures narrate that the earliest Christians gathered on the first day of the week (Sunday) for the 'breaking of the bread'. 'Breaking of the Bread' is one of the earliest names of what today is called 'going to Mass' or celebrating the Eucharist.

Calling it or making it an obligation diminishes its spiritual reality. It is a privileged opportunity beyond all measure. Vatican II declares the Eucharist to be the 'source and summit' of Christian life and living. The Eucharist defines Christianity. It is the People of God gathered together as a community of faith, singing together God's praise, listening together to His word and together being fed as the Body of Christ with His Body and Blood. There is no substitute for this **reality of faith.** A live-streamed Mass only partially allows us to enter this mystery of faith. We can partially see and hear, but there is the total absence of the touch of the Eucharist, the taste of Lord's Body and Blood in our mouths and the unique smells of church buildings and the company of fellow believers. The Mass is the total human and sacramental encounter of Christ with his **people.** It is the fullness and completeness of what Christ intended at the Last Supper when it says he "... blessed ... broke ... gave" and said, "All must drink of it" [Mt.26:27]; "Do this in remembrance of me." [Lk. 22:19].

These are not 'off stage' comments by Christ. These are some of the very last words he spoke to us on the last evening of his earthly life. Entering into the fullness of the mystery of the Eucharist puts us into full communion with God's divine life. To knowingly and willfully walk away from such an invitation literally puts us out of communion with God, who established this as the way in which he comes to us.

In reinstating the Sunday obligation Bishop Folda is inviting Catholics to once again recognize the absolute minimum of what it means to practice one's faith in Christ. It seems quite unreasonable to use fear of going to Mass because of COVID and not fear going to school, going to work, going to sporting events, going to social outings, going shopping, etc. and to top that off by staying at home from Sunday Mass because the bishop has dispensed us of the obligation to attend. That dispensation is being lifted May 1st.

For the mature of faith and the prudent of mind now is the time reclaim our zeal for Christ, and our passion for the Eucharist and its fullness that comes with 'going to Mass' and gathering to celebrate and receive the gift that keeps on giving – the body and blood of Christ!
