PASTOR'S NOTES

'O' Antiphons – the closing days of Advent

Starting December 17th the tone of Advent shifts. It becomes more focused on the one who is to come, the one who will do marvelous things. It is seven days before Christmas eve with seven being the biblical number symbolizing perfection as in the seven days of creation. In these seven days before Christmas eve we set our hearts more earnestly of God's providential love throughout history culminating in the mystery of Christmas.

The song – **O** Come, **O** Come, Emmanuel – proclaims seven (7) attributes of the 'Coming One'. The origin of this song goes back to an anonymous monk of the 7th or 8th century, who was seeking to deepen his preparation for the great solemnity of Christmas and especially the person of Jesus, the Messiah. This song is characterized by its 'O' antiphons, which are Old Testament images signifying the hope of Israel, who put their trust in God. Each 'O' antiphon rises to a new level of fulfillment with the one born in Bethlehem:

- > The first 'O' antiphon wisdom [Sapientia] acknowledges that God's wisdom fills and gives order to all things. The coming Christ will make incarnate (visible) this wisdom.
- > The second 'O' antiphon Lord [Adonai] remembers God's revelation of his name and his law to Moses. The coming Christ will bring us into covenant with God's inner life.

> The third 'O' antiphon – Flower of Jesse [Radix] – recalls God's promise to King David, whose grandfather was Jesse. When all seemed dead, Jesse's stump sprouts new life with the coming Christ who dies on the Tree of Calvary.


- > The fourth 'O' antiphon Key of David [Clavix] remembers the loss of Paradise and humanity becoming imprisoned to their own desires. The coming Christ breaches the darkness of sin and unlocks heavenly life.
- > The fifth 'O' antiphon Radiant Dawn [Oriens] acknowledges God's people often walk in darkness and the shadow of death. The coming Christ is the 'Dayspring from on high', who is the light of the world.
- > The sixth 'O' antiphon King of nations [Rex] recalls that God's Chosen People often became frozen in notions of privilege and status. The coming Christ comes to serve, to give his life as ransom for the many, to bring all things into one - He is King of Kings!!!
- > The seventh 'O' antiphon God with us [Emmanuel] reminds us that Israel's great consolation was that God was close to them. The coming Christ takes on human flesh (becoming one of us) and lives with us until the end of the ages.

The traditional order of the seven 'O' antiphons describe Christ as: Wisdom, Lord of Might, Rod of Jesse, Key of David, Radiant Dawn, King of Nations and Emmanuel {'God with us'}. There is an interesting note to this ordering of the seven 'O' antiphons when they are translated into Latin (as they appear above within brackets). The Latin translation for each of the above antiphons are: Sapientia, Adonai, Radix, Clavix, Oriens, Rex and Emmanuel. If you take the first letter and each of these Latin translations and reverse them they spell out the phrase — *ERO CRAS* — which translates "Tomorrow I shall be there".

After seven days of proclaiming the great attributes of Christ and asking him to come in the 'O' antiphons, it seems so fitting that ERO CRAS comes to fulfillment in the Christmas feast. In these last days of this Advent season may the 'O' antiphons lead our meditations on the one who comes at Christmas.
