Christmas season

The Christmas season is the shortest season of the church's liturgical life. It begins with the celebration of the Christmas Mass and extends through the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which falls on Sunday, January 9th. The Baptism of the Lord celebrates the beginning of Christ's 3-year public ministry of walking the land of Israel and doing the works recorded in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

Within the short season of Christmas we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family (December 26^{th}) and the solemnities of Mary, Mother of God (January 1^{st}) and the Epiphany of the Lord (January 2^{nd}).

Christmas is much more than the sentimental reflection upon the manger scene. The Christmas season is really the Gospel in miniature. All the major themes that are found in the public ministry of Jesus are found in miniature in the stories that dominate the Christmas season. For example:

- (1) the angel's song at the birth of Jesus [Lk. 2:14] reminds us that Christ came to unite heaven and earth, which had been rent apart by the sin of our first parents;
- (2) when Jesus is found in the Temple [Lk. 2:41-49] he reminds his parents he must be about his Father's business, which is the essence of Christ's prayer in the garden of Gethsemane;
- (3) the story of the Magi [Mt. 2:1-12] remind us of the universality (catholicity) of Christ's mission to the whole of the human race;
- (4) Simeon's prophecy to Mary [Lk. 2:34-35] that her heart would be pierced by a sword looks forward to that famous sculpture work of the *Pieta* where she holds the body of her son as he is taken down from the Cross. Discipleship is marked by suffering.

With this reflection in mind may our Christmas season be a little richer in appreciating the wonder of God's love, which begins in a manger, is seemingly 'snuffed out' on Calvary, but breaks the bonds of death at Easter only to fill the world at Pentecost with the unconquerable hope of eternal life. As John's Gospel says, "... through him the world was made, yet the world did not know who he was. To his own he came, yet his own did not accept him. Anyone who did accept him he empowered to become children of God... of his fullness we have all had a share ... love following upon love." [Jn 1: 10-12,16]

Such is the beauty and splendor of Christmas, of Christmas people, of a Christmas world!
