PASTOR'S NOTES

Preplanning 10 days out —

Lent is just 10 days away!

Usually Lent sneaks up on us and all of a sudden we find ourselves in the midst of deciding of how to fruitfully engage the spirit of Lent. Lent challenges us to an intensification of the three legs of the spiritual life — **prayer**, almsgiving and fasting. These three legs of the spiritual life are directly related to the three basic relationships that comprise our lives:

- 1) our relationship with God [prayer];
- 2) our relationship with others [almsgiving];
- 3) our relationship with ourselves [fasting].

Here are some preliminary Lenten thoughts for your consideration:

> in what ways could Lent 2023 be more rich in prayer?

- * celebrate daily Mass when able;
- * begin every meal time with a prayer of thanks to the Lord;
- * read a little something about each of the 12 saints whose feast days fall during this 40-day Lenten season {consult the church calendar for the 12 saints days};
- * pray Stations of the Cross on Lenten Friday evenings;
- * participate in the Sunday evening Lenten Ecumenical Services;
- * plan to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation {go to Confession} at one of the many area Lenten Reconciliation Services;
- * make a special effort to attend all the Holy Week liturgies [Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening].

> in what ways could Lent 2023 be more attentive to the needs of others {almsgiving}?

- * phone calls; Easter greeting cards; visits to persons in nursing homes, prison, hospitals or home-bound; more intentional family time;
- * being generous to our Lenten canister collections and the special collections on Ash Wednesday and Holy Thursday;
- * strive towards tithing and/or sacrificial church offertory giving;
- * support the God's Gift Appeal of the Diocese of Fargo.

> in what ways could Lent 2023 be more self-disciplined {fasting}?

* choose a spiritual or corporal work of mercy as a particular goal for this Lent;

[corporal: feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; shelter the homeless; clothe the naked; visit the sick; visit the imprisoned; bury the dead]

[spiritual: instruct the ignorant; admonish the sinner; counsel the doubtful; comfort the sorrow ful; bear wrongs patiently; forgive injuries; pray for the living and the dead]

- * honor **both** Ash Wednesday and Good Friday as days of **fast** [only 1 full meal with the other two being much smaller] and **abstinence** [no meat]
- * honor Lenten Fridays as days of **abstinence** [no meat];
- * make a concerted effort to break the rule of a disordered passion in one's life {alcohol, porn, drugs, tobacco, unnecessary screen time, etc.}.

This week's Stewardship moment:

"For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." \sim Matthew 5:20
