St. Valentine's Day – what's the scoop??

At this past Wednesday night's RE classes I asked students what 'big day' was coming up and a couple responded – *Valentine's Day*. When I asked what day was St. Valentine's feast day? – a number said February 14th. Seems logical, but when you look at the Church calendar of saints that has been handed out, February 14th lists Saints Cyril and Methodius as the saints of that day. **So, what's the scoop???**

The Church does record the death of a martyred Roman priest name Valentine on February 14th in the mid 200s. He was buried in a Roman cemetery. After these facts the story becomes quite murky and a legend emerged that before his martyrdom and while imprisoned Valentine healed his jailer's daughter of blindness. Just prior to his execution he supposedly wrote that girl a note signing it *Your Valentine'*. Thus, over the centuries has come the practice of sending Valentine cards. Beyond Valentine's martyrdom nothing of this legend story is historically verifiable.

Since Vatican II [1962-65] and the revision of the Roman calendar of saints, the Church has much more strictly adhered to the principle of being historically accurate about the lives of saints whom are put forth for our veneration.

In the case of St. Valentine there is no verifiable evidence of his connection to the modern notion of romantic love that has become culturally associated with what we know as Valentine's Day. This notion of romantic love and its connection to this time of year is probably more connected to pagan customs which noted this is the time of year that birds begin to mate and soon festivities about human romantic love began to emerge.

In today's Church calendar we celebrate the saints - Cyril and Methodius on February 14th!!
