Good stewards recognize that God is working through them, and they don't put themselves above the people they have been called to help.

PASTOR'S NOTES

Getting a head-start on 'the Forty'

The Forty is the 40 days of Lent, which will begin in ten days on Wednesday, February 18th (Ash Wednesday). Forty (40) is that symbolic number in Scripture representing a time of change, a passing from one way of life to a new reality. In Noah's time it rained 40 days and nights before God restores his covenant; Moses spent 40 days and nights on Mt. Sinai before receiving God's Ten Commandments; the Israelites spent 40 years in the desert before entering into the Promised Land; Christ spent 40 days in the desert before beginning his public ministry that ends in the saving mystery of His Death and Resurrection.

In this same spirit we go through a 40-day 'desert experience' (Lent) as the pathway to Easter joy. Our Ash Wednesday Gospel will call us to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. **These are the essential practices of a well lived spiritual life.** During Lent the Church encourages a special intensification of these spiritual practices.

In praying we recognize all honor and glory belongs to GOD! Living depends on praying!!

Perhaps this year we will enter the spirit of prayer – some possibilities to explore:

- > attend Ash Wednesday Mass
- > attend daily Mass {when possible}
- > attend Friday Stations of the Cross
- > celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation {Lenten Reconciliation Services or Saturday afternoon}
- > attend Holy Week services: {Chrism Mass, Tenebrae, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil}
- > pray before every meal
- > morning & evening prayer
- > attend Lenten Ecumenical Services

In fasting we recognize our need to discipline passions and excesses in our lives so as not to become indifferent and ungrateful to God and lose our focus for doing what is good, right and holy.

Perhaps this year we will enter the spirit of fasting – some possibilities to explore:

- > give up some amenity (e.g.- food item, unnecessary computer time, TV/movies, etc.)
- > keep days of abstinence (no meat) on all Lenten Fridays
- > keep days of fast (2 small daily meals) and abstinence {Ash Wednesday and Good Friday}
- > fast from the 7 capital sins: {pride, lust, greed, gluttony, sloth, anger, envy}
- > come early for Sunday Mass and prayerfully dispose oneself for the Eucharist
- > honor the 3rd Commandment by refraining from all unnecessary work of Sunday

In almsgiving we 'die to ourselves' and live for other people's highest good {Shalom}.

Perhaps this year we will enter the spirit of almsgiving – some possibilities to explore:

- > attend to the corporal works of mercy: {feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; clothe the naked; shelter the homeless; visit the imprisoned; visit the sick; bury the dead}
- > serve a meal for the homeless at Churches United for the Homeless or Salvation Army
- > attend to the spiritual works of mercy: {admonish the sinner; instruct the ignorant; counsel the doubtful; comfort the sorrowful; bear wrongs patiently; forgive injuries; pray for the living and the dead}
- > give generously to the Ash Wednesday collection, the Holy Thursday collection, the Lenten canisters
- > strive towards financial giving of tithing, i.e., 5% to your local parish, 4% to personal charities, and 1% to the diocesan God's Gift Appeal
- > pray for all those joining the Church this Easter Vigil
