### **PASTOR'S NOTES**

### Encouraged to attend ...

This past Tuesday I attended the **January 17<sup>th</sup> Listening Session** at Holy Spirit Church in Fargo in preparation for our diocesan synod in April of 2024. *It was a very good experience!* Over 80 people attended – first spending an hour in prayer before the exposed Blessed Sacrament, which was interspersed with two Scripture readings meant to focus our prayer of seeking the Holy Spirit's direction for the Diocese of Fargo in the upcoming years. For the next hour and a half we went to Holy Spirit's social hall and broke into 13 groups around tables discussing three topics: (1) what is going well in parish and diocesan life? (2) what are three challenges facing parish and diocesan life? (3) what can I do in meeting the needs of the parish and diocesan church? The meeting concluded with each group sharing a summary of their group's discussion.

<u>In terms of what is going well</u> – availability of the sacraments and prayer opportunities, respect and reverence for the sacraments and their celebration, lots of learning opportunities for learning in this digital age (e.g. - blogs, etc.); in terms of *challenges* – lack of well-equipped lay leaders both in catechesis and relationships, lack of authentic communities where we accompany people and not just get them in the doors, lack of basic understandings of Church teachings, practices and devotions, gaps in church life between urban and rural parishes; in terms of *what I can do* – become a prayer warrior for the many needs within the church and the world, give joyful witness, attend education events, volunteer and 'step up to the plate', build relationships with others.

It was a wonderful time of attentive listening and sharing. I would highly encourage parishioners to join in one of the two remaining <u>Listening Sessions</u> in Fargo/West Fargo –

# Monday, January 23<sup>rd</sup> —

Over the last number of years the United States Catholic Bishops marked January 22<sup>nd</sup> as a **Day of Prayer** for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. Since January 22<sup>nd</sup> falls on a Sunday this year, they moved this day of prayer for 2023 to Monday, January 23<sup>rd</sup>. January 22<sup>nd</sup> had been the infamous day in 1973 when the Supreme Court had legalized abortion in America.

Since the Supreme Court overturned the 1973 *Roe vs. Wade* decision this past June, a political firestorm has erupted in this country. Now each of the 50 states are enacting laws regarding the issue of abortion. Some states are outlawing the practice of abortion while others are writing 'the right to abortion' into their state laws. It is obvious the pro-life movement has a long ways to go in cultivating a respect for the life of unborn children in the hearts and minds of millions of Americans. Prayer is a good place to start and it is that spirit that drove the United States Catholic Bishops to set aside a day for such prayer. *Perhaps you could attend daily Mass, pray a Rosary, pray the Stations of the Cross, make a Holy Hour, pray the Divine Mercy chaplet, make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament* – all in the spirit of converting hearts and minds to the gift of unborn life that is threatened by the barbarism of pro abortion policies and misguided politicians.
