PASTOR'S NOTES

A Combo – Annual meeting & 'Parish synod'

On Sunday, February 6th St. Leo's will be having their annual parish meeting in combination with their 'parish synod' for all parishioners following the 10:30 a.m. Mass in the Spirit of Life Center. Such events seems to call forth a little reflection on parish life in general.

Years ago parish life played a central part in people's daily lives. Spiritual and social activities were a commonly part of a church's weekly life. There was the CYO for the youth, the Knights of Columbus for the men and altar societies/sodalities for women. Obviously life has changed: the explosion of social media, the ease of transportation, the all-encompassing place of sports, the rise of technology, etc. People find themselves going a thousand different directions. In all of this parish life has taken a hit!

Yet when one thinks about it -- the essence of parish life remains the same. For people of faith, parish life is structured around the essentials of the spiritual life.

Lives of faith need to be nurtured and lived in parish settings that offer camaraderie and fellowship with places to pray, and offer public praise and worship.

Beyond meeting Christ and others in prayer and sacraments lives of faith need to be formed in the depth and wisdom of God's call to virtue and holiness.

Certainly lives of faith are called beyond themselves to the care of others in the many needs of the human condition.

Lives of faith know the certainty of death but bask in the promise of the resurrection and celebrate this belief in our care for the dying and our respect for the dead.

In all of this lives of faith understand the need for facilities and the stewardship of finances to underwrite this enterprise of faith.

In summary this is the very way our parish life is structured – <u>committees</u> on liturgy, education, social concerns, cemetery operations and finance and administration.

A parish is not just a place where sacraments are celebrated and religion classes are taught. Hopefully a parish is a community of people (a family) who encounter one another as believers, disciples, and brothers and sisters in Christ. The vibrancy of parish life is a concerted effort of all parishioners who honor their heritage, give of themselves, affirm others, seek the best, live in thanksgiving, all the while firmly believing the best lies ahead when the Lords says to us, "Well done good and faithful servant! Inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the creation of the world."

This year we would like to combine our 'parish synod' with our annual meeting. After a short summary by the chairpersons of our 5 parish committees we would like to break up into groups of six to eight persons and conduct our 'parish synod'. A 'parish synod' is the parishioners coming together under the guidance of the Holy Spirit to reflect, discuss and discern together what the Holy Spirit is asking of us as parishioners of St. Leo's parish and in the Catholic Church at large – What are our best practices?

What could be done better? What is the Holy Spirit asking of the Catholic Church as we enter the Third Millennium of our existence? Do we have shared goals as the Church? What can be done to fix shortcomings? Etc.
