Blessing of Throats

Every February 3rd we celebrate the memorial of St. Blaise, who is often associated with the Catholic sacramental of the *Blessing of Throats*.

The story goes that St. Blaise was bishop of Sebaste, Armenia (present day Turkey) in the early 300s. This was an age of vicious persecution of Christians under the Roman emperor, Licinius. Blaise was known for his ability to heal and cure. While imprisoned Blaise miraculously cured a young boy who nearly died because of a fishbone caught in his throat. Supposedly he used two candles that had been brought to him in prison and placed them in the form of a cross around the boy's throat. Blaise was later beheaded and is now known as a martyr in the life of the Church. Since the 8th century St. Blaise has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.

The Church's present <u>Book of Blessings</u> acknowledges that "suffering and illness have always been among the greatest problems that trouble the human spirit ... Part of the plan laid out by God's providence is that we should fight strenuously against all sickness and carefully seek the blessings of good health ... The blessing of the sick by ministers of the Church is a very ancient custom, rooted in imitation of Christ himself and his apostles. ... In the United States the annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of a Christian ... the blessing may be given by touching the throat of each person with two candles blessed on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord (February 2nd) and which are joined together in the form of the cross."

The <u>Book of Blessings</u> speaks of candles that were blessed on the The feast of the Presentation of the Lord [February 2nd]. This feast of the Presentation is always the 40th day after Christmas which is narrated in Luke's Gospel [Luke 2:22-35]. Jewish practice was that 40 days after the birth of a son the mother was to be purified and the first-born son was to be "consecrated to the Lord." At this presentation of Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem Simeon acknowledges Jesus to be "a revealing light to the Gentiles, the glory of your people Israel." Out of this biblical narrative arose the practice of blessing candles for home use and the candles used in bestowing the blessing associated with St. Blaise on February 3rd.

In that spirit there will be the *Blessing of Throats* at St. Leo's on Thursday, February 3rd at the conclusion of the 9:00 a.m. daily Mass. We invite parishioners, who can, to attend daily Mass and receive this blessing.


