# **PASTOR'S NOTES**

# 2 (two) Prayer items for January —

Not just in the cold month of January, but in every month, there are two items of particular human concern that need our prayer and solicitude:

1) Twice in the 2000+ years of Christian Church history the Church has suffered ruptures that remain unhealed to this day. **In the 1000s** there was a split between the East and the West. In the East this gave rise to what is now known as the Eastern Orthodox churches (e.g.— Greek and Russian Orthodox). **In the 1500s** there was the split in western Christianity into what is now popularly known as the Catholic and various Protestant churches.

Such divisions certainly violate the very prayer of unity for which Christ prayed at the end of the Last Supper when he said, "I pray also for those who will believe in me through their word, that all may be one as you, Father, are in me and I in you: I pray that they may be one in us that the world may believe that you sent me." [Jn 17:20b-21] The Second Vatican Council [1962-65] recognized that the restoration of Christian Unity was one of its principal concerns. Prayer is the soul of the ecumenical movement.

With this in mind, on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>January 19<sup>th</sup></u> the Casselton Ministerium will be hosting an ecumenical Song and Word fest in honor of the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** [January 18-25] at St. Leo's Church <u>starting at 6:45 p.m.</u> followed by a little reception of coffee and bars at about 7:30 p.m. All are invited in doing our part of praying that "all may be one" as Christ asked of us.

2) 49 years ago on January 22, 1973, the United States Supreme Court effectively legalized the killing of unborn children in a court decision known as *Roe v. Wade* and a companion case known as *Doe v. Bolton*. Since that day the Church has unceasingly worked to create a culture of life in this nation including the overturning of this horrific court decision. Killing of the unborn should never be conceived as legal in any fashion. Again prayer must constantly lead this effort. The bishops of the United States ask that Saturday, January 22<sup>nd</sup> be observed as a "day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."

# **Children's Envelopes**

As part of our parish stewardship strategy we provide each RE student with a packet of Sunday Offertory envelopes to help them get in the habit of supporting their church. All the money raised through the student's Offertory envelopes is given to the charity known as *Friends of Chimbote*. This charity was born out of the mission work of Fr. Jack Davis, who spent most of his priesthood working with the poor of Chimbote, Peru. He was ordained in 1969 as a priest for the Diocese of Fargo and later released to do missionary work in South America. Over the years his mission work took form and emerged into today's organization – *Friends of Chimbote* – which helps thousands of poverty-stricken people with the basic necessities of life and trains people in basic skills so as to care for themselves. This is the wonderful charity supported by our RE students Sunday Offertory envelopes.

**Parents** – please encourage your students to use their Sunday Offertory envelopes in support of such a worthy charity. Presently only about 10 students regularly use their envelopes and over the last 10 years total student envelope giving has fallen from a high of \$1542 {2016} to all time low of \$458 in 2021. This is in spite of the fact that student numbers have increased over this time period. **With parents' support I believe we can do better.** 

In the off chance your students forgets his Sunday envelope at home, there are supplemental student envelopes at the rear of the church for their use. Just have your student write their name on that supplemental envelope before putting it into the Offertory collection. Thank you!!
