

PASTOR’S NOTES

Who is telling us *‘the Good News’* ?

For the remainder of this church year, i.e., through Saturday, November 26th, our Sunday Gospel readings will be taken from the Gospel of Luke. **Who is Luke, the Gospel writer?**

As with all four Gospels, the Gospel writer is never specifically mentioned in any Gospel text attributed to that writer. That leads to an obvious question — **how do we know Luke wrote the Gospel attributed to him?**

A number of ancient writers/writings dating back to the late 100s attribute this Gospel to Luke (e.g. - Irenaeus [130-200 A.D.], Tertullian [160-220 A.D], etc.).

The Gospel writer Luke is considered to be a Gentile (non-Jewish) convert to Christianity, who is closely associated with the apostle Paul. The person of Luke is specifically mentioned three time in the New Testament [*Philemon 24, Colossians 4:14, and 2 Timothy 4:11*]. The Colossians’ reference notes Luke as a physician. In each of these references Luke is a companion of the Apostle Paul as he journeys throughout the Middle East. In addition the Acts of the Apostles has a number of *‘We-sections’* implying that Paul and Luke have an ongoing relationship in spreading the Gospel throughout the missionary journeys of St. Paul. With this information many biblical scholars believe that Luke also authored the *Acts of the Apostles*.

For Luke, history is the story of salvation that climaxes with Jesus of Nazareth. It is a journey that begins in the obscurity of Nazareth in Galilee and ending with Jesus in Jerusalem. From Jerusalem the Gospel of Christ is taken to Rome *{the center of the known world at that time}*. Ultimately Christ’s journey ends in the heavenly Jerusalem. Jerusalem represents the covenant God made with Israel and Rome represents the known world with the heavenly Jerusalem representing the destiny of the human race. Heaven is where God and the human race will exist in a communion of life and love for eternity.

For Luke this work of salvation began in earnest when Christ makes a firm decision to go to Jerusalem. Luke’s Gospel narrates, *“When the days for Jesus being taken up was fulfilled, he resolutely determined to go to Jerusalem...”* [Lk. 9:51]. The journey to Jerusalem is a major theme in Luke’s Gospel. **Jerusalem is Christ’s city of destiny and also ours!** As Jesus himself will say, *“no prophet can be allowed to die anywhere except in Jerusalem”* [Lk. 13:33]. In that city he will be crucified, but also be raised from the dead and ascend to eternal life with his heavenly Father. From that heavenly home he and the Father will send Christ’s risen Spirit into human history *{the story of Pentecost}* to teach us everything and remind us all of what Christ has told us. Christ’s heavenly destiny is also the destiny for all who faithfully conform their lives to him.

Christ’s journey to Jerusalem is also our journey. He teaches many lessons about the spiritual life. Hopefully we will take these lessons to heart, make them our own and become more Christ-like in our thoughts, words and deeds.

With this being the focus of our attention, we become aware that life is a journey and there is a destiny for all of us. May this journey be to, *“the holy city Jerusalem ... (where) .. nothing unclean will enter it ... Only those will enter whose names are written in the Lamb’s book of life.”* [Rev. 21:10, 27].
