Father's Day

Next Sunday (the third Sunday of June) is designated as Father's Day in the United States as well as in many other countries throughout the world.

Celebrations of fathers and fatherhood have existed for centuries dating back to the Middle Ages. For most of Catholic Europe the celebration of fathers and fatherhood is closely linked to the feast of St. Joseph on March 19th. St. Joseph is the foster father of the Jesus, Son of God, and husband to the Blessed Virgin Mary. This celebration was brought across the oceans by the many missionaries who planted the Catholic faith in the Americas.

Outside the Catholic tradition Father's Day was not celebrated in the United States until the 20th century and then only sporadically. There was a celebration in 1908 in West Virginia to honor 250 fathers who were killed in a tragic mining accident. There was a celebration in 1910 in Spokane, Washington. A bill was introduced in Congress in 1913 seeking national recognition for a Father's Day, but over the years Congress resisted such a proclamation fearing it would simply become a commercialized affair. Then, in 1966 Lyndon Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers with President Nixon making it a permanent national holiday in 1972.

Like Mother's Day, Father's Day is spelled in the singular and not the plural. **This day is meant to celebrate each of our particular fathers** and not fatherhood in general. Each of us has a father, who along with our mothers, have brought us to life. Over the years their watchful eyes, wise counsel and fatherly care have guided and protected us. For this we owe our deepest gratitude! With this in mind let us remember our fathers next Sunday!

4th Annual Rural Life Celebration

On Sunday June 27th Bishop Folda will be hosting the fourth annual *Rural Life Celebration* at the Russ and Mary Mauch farm near Barney, ND. **Barney is a few miles west of I-29 off the Wahpeton exit 23** [Highway 13].

Things will start at 4 p.m. with blessing land and machinery; Mass at 4:30 p.m. followed by meal and entertainment; the event is free and open to all – more information is available on the flyer in the entry way.

It is good to remember that economic systems emerge because farmers produce more than they need for themselves freeing the rest of us to engage in other jobs. Therefore, all economic systems stand on the backs of agriculture, farming and rural life. This is the spirit that lies behind Bishop Folda's desire to celebrate rural life.
