PASTOR'S NOTES

The <u>Ascension</u> — no small mystery of faith!

By way of introduction — The Acts of the Apostles tells us that after Christ's Resurrection from the tomb he appeared to his disciples "over the course of 40 days" and spoke to them about the reign of God. Then he ascended into heaven. This 40th day become known as Ascension Thursday and for centuries was a holy day of obligation in the Catholic Church. A number of years ago most diocesan bishops in the United States moved this solemnity and holy day from Thursday to the 7th Sunday of the Easter season. This was done to ensure that the mystery of the Ascension would be celebrated when a large number of the faithful gather in worship of God. Since the 7th Sunday of Easter (which is actually the 43rd day of the Easter season) was the closest to this 40th day after Easter, the 7th Sunday of Easter was replaced with the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord.

Great truths imbedded in the Ascension mystery:

- Restored access to heaven and God's life and happiness. Access to heaven had been closed since the sin of our first parents in the Garden of Eden. When God expelled them from the garden, God "stationed the cherubim and the fiery revolving sword, to guard the way to the tree of life" [Gen. 5:24]. In discussing being 'born again' with Nicodemus, Christ said, "No one has ascended into heaven, but he who has descended from heaven, the Son of man" [Jn. 3:13]. Left to our natural powers humanity does not have access to the Father's house.
- 2) We are a pilgrim people, simply sojourners in this land. Our real home is heaven. Do not get too attached to the things of this world. They are passing realities. As St. Paul reminds us, "We do not fix our gaze on what is seen but on what is unseen. What is seen is transitory; what is unseen lasts forever" [2 Cor. 4:18], and "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" [Philippians 3:20].
- 3) The deification of human nature. What is radically new in Christ's Ascension is that he now sits bodily at the Father's right hand because the Son became incarnate (took on human flesh) and now the glorified flesh of his humanity is imbedded into the Godhead. When we rise and stand before the throne of God we shall see the human face of Christ. At the end of time, if we find ourselves counted among the saved, like Christ we, too, will receive glorified bodies and find ourselves at the throne of the Father. What we do now in our earthly flesh is of great consequence. If our flesh is to be glorified, we must now live in the flesh in ways that are in keeping with what our glorified existence will someday be.
- 4) <u>Christ now lives in the sacraments.</u> As our patron saint, St. Leo the Great, so richly said when speaking about the Ascension, "And so our Redeemer's visible presence has passed into the sacraments." Christ has not abandoned us in the Ascension, but lives more fully in the sacraments of his Church. Let us joyfully seek the life of Christ in his seven sacraments.
- 5) <u>Presently</u> the exalted Christ intercedes for us. As Scripture says, "... (Christ) exercises his priesthood for he 'always lives to make intercession' for 'those who draw near to God through him' [Heb. 7:25]. As 'high priest of the good things yet to come' he is the center and principal actor of the liturgy that honors the Father in heaven" [Heb. 9:11]. As the Creed says, it is from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead.
