# **PASTOR'S NOTES**

## 8th Annual Rural Life Celebration

This coming Sunday (June 29<sup>th</sup>) the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Rural Life Celebration will be hosted on the --

Calvin and Linda Leyendecker farm south of Jamestown [4585 97th Ave. SE, Marion, ND 58466].

#### Festivities will be as follows:

4:00 p.m. Welcome

4:30 p.m. Mass (will be indoors)

5:30 p.m. blessing of land, machinery, animals

6:00 p.m. meal

This event is free and open to all. Visitors are invited to bring a bag of soil or seed from their farms to be blessed.

As a rural diocese we know the absolute value of farming and the gift of the land. All economists tell us that farming is the absolute building block of all economic systems. The right to life begins by having food to eat. In the most primitive of societies we were all either hunters or gatherers because we needed food to live and food was acquired by either hunting for food or gathering fruit from the land to eat.

As societies became more sophisticated, people became more able to produce more than they needed for themselves. Being able to raise such a surplus of food allows others to engage in many other enterprises of economic life and not spend our lives raising food to feed themselves. **Agriculture and the production of food is the foundation of all economic life.** Only when each person can produce more than they need to survive, only then can others be freed up to engage in other enterprises and businesses that create the market places in which we all live. It is this reality that the Diocese rightly celebrates and acknowledges in annually having a rural life celebration. We are all connected to rural life and owe much to those 'who farm for us' and allow us to live the lives we live. **Long live our farmers!** 

As the recent storms have demonstrated rural life and agriculture (and by extension – all of us) are completely dependent on these forces of nature.

Therefore, it is good for us to pray for good weather and protection from ferocious winds, damaging hail, debilitating droughts, pestilences, etc. On the other hand it is good for us to thank God for his providential gifting us with rich soil, the treasure of sunshine, the timeliness of rain and moisture, etc. For our part we must pray that farmers, farm laborers and ag businesses be blessed with the spirit of good stewardship and care/reverence for all that God has 'loaned' them by which to serve the common good.

If possible I invite all parishioners to this year's Rural Life Celebration at the Calvin and Linda Leyendecker farm near Marion, ND this Sunday.
