PASTOR'S NOTES

Pentecost - centerpiece of the Paschal Mystery

With the celebration of Pentecost the 50 day of the Easter season comes to a close. We often speak of Pentecost as the coming of the Holy Spirit. **That is not quite true!!** The Holy Spirit has been active in history from the beginning when God's spirit hovered above the waters of creation. In fact the Holy Spirit has been active in history from its very start.

To this effect Pope St. Leo the Great writes,

"Let us not doubt that when on Pentecost the Holy Spirit filled the Lord's disciples, he was not giving his gift for the first time but was rather extending a gift already given. The patriarchs, the prophets, the priests, and all the saints of earlier times were nourished by the same sanctifying spirit. No sacrament was ever instituted, no mystery ever celebrated, that did not involve his grace. The power of his gifts had ever been the same, though the gifts had not been given in so great a measure."

So what's with Pentecost and the Holy Spirit?

First and foremost the Paschal Mystery is a unity that is all tied together by Pentecost. As a unity, the Paschal Mystery [Christ's Death, Resurrection and Ascension] is God's plan of salvation for the human race.

The <u>necessary</u> first step in this plan is God becoming man, which is known as the Incarnation [the feast of Christmas] when the Holy Spirit comes upon Mary and she conceives Christ in her womb. From there the Holy Spirit leads Christ to Calvary where he offers his life for the forgiveness of sin. By the spirit of the Resurrection the Father accepts his son's sacrifice, and led by the Spirit Christ ascends to heaven from whence he first came. In the Pentecost event God's plan of salvation reaches its climax. As Pope St. Leo the Great writes,

"This day contains within itself the great mysteries of the old and new economies, showing clearly that the law had foretold grace and that grace brought the fulfillment of the law. It was on the fiftieth day after the sacrifice of the lamb that the law was given on Mount Sinai to the Hebrews who had been liberated from Egypt. So too, once Christ had suffered and the true Lamb of God had been slain, it was on the fiftieth day after his resurrection that the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles and the multitude of believers. The alert Christian will readily see that the initial events of the Old Testament served the gospel in its beginning and that the second covenant had its origin in the same Spirit who had instituted the first."

Now, in Pentecost, the Holy Spirit bestows himself in a fullness of ways to strengthen our faith and deepen our unity in being Temples of the Holy Spirit, as the People of God, and as the Body of Christ.

All of history is caught up in the Holy Spirit! The Holy Spirit of the Risen Christ does not just act in the solemn acts of church counsels and the Pope, but as is often forgotten – in the constant activity of the Holy Spirit in the sacraments. Again, as Pope St. Leo the Great was fond of saying 'all that Christ accomplished in history has now passed into the sacraments'. The risen Christ is truly present in every sacrament - his very life in Baptism, his missionary spirit in Confirmation, his Body and Blood in the Eucharist, his healing power in the anointing of the sick, his forgiving love in reconciliation, his faithful love in marriage, and his shepherding spirit in ordination.

Such is the glory of Pentecost!
