PASTOR'S NOTES

While our elevator is 'down and out' . . .

On April 10th our elevator maintenance man informed us that St. Leo's church elevator was no longer operational and would need to be modernized and updated. The elevator's operational board 'was shot' and this elevator type (Ascension) was no longer being made. Therefore, there are no available parts to fix it.

With that being the case, we solicited two bids for modernizing and updating our elevator. Our Pastoral Council and Finance Committee reviewed the bids and selected the one from Otis Elevator Company. As we sign this contract and move forward it will take at least ten (10) weeks before we will have an operational elevator.

In the meantime we do have a handicap ramp in the alley between the church and the rectory. The ramp connects to the walkway between the rectory and church. Once in that walkway one can get to the church and through the church to the parish offices but there is no access to the church's lower level.

Until we have an operational elevator the door to the walkway from the handicap ramp will be open before and during daily and weekend Mass times. If you should find that door locked or know that you will need that door unlocked at some other time, please call the parish office (347-4609) and one of us will make sure that door is open for your use. We truly appreciate your patience and understanding regarding this matter. If you have any questions or concerns do not hesitate to contact me.
