PASTOR'S NOTES

Advent - a proleptic time --

Prolepsis is not a commonly used word, but is something for which most of us are somewhat familiar. Prolepsis is the time between an already anticipated future event and its present ongoing reality. For example, if a person is sitting on a dock and they see it is raining in the near distance, it is probably fair to assume rain will soon be falling on the deck – *it is raining but not here yet*. **Christ has come already, but not yet in his fullness!** Such is proleptic time.

Advent bridges these two comings – recalling the First Coming 2000+ years ago all the while preparing for his future Second Coming.

To prepare well for the Second Coming we revisit the First Coming in order to assimilate and take on a spiritual life that will form us anew into the 'image and likeness' of God that was deeply tarnished by the sin of our first parents in the garden of Eden, but was fully restored in the person of Christ. By taking on our human nature {the Christmas mystery} Christ came so we would come 'to know God's love', to be our 'model of holiness' and made us 'partakers of the divine nature.' In this he redeemed the human race for those with eyes to see and minds to understand. To prepare for such a wondrous event is the 'heart and soul' of the Advent season.

A well-conceived and well-lived Advent is the gateway to a true Christmas!!

Advent events - of which to take note -

1) charitable opportunities

- > 'Gifts for the baby' with the celebration of the birth of Baby Jesus on the horizon Advent is a time to help mothers in need to clothe and care for their babies. See the set-up in the church entry for details about how you can help today's babies!
- > 'O Antiphon Food Collection' First Link is not organizing a Giving Tree program this year. In its place we suggest taking up a collection of food items for our local food pantry and beginning it on December 17th. The Gospel acclamations of the last seven days of Advent [December 17th 24th] proclaim the coming of Christ with seven 'O Antiphons'. The song *O Come*, *Emmanuel* proclaims these antiphons as characteristics of the One to come. The One who comes tells us to care for those in need and to love our neighbor. A food collection during these 'O Antiphons' days would seem to honor the spirit of those days.

2) free spiritual reading material

- > 'The Word Among Us' has all the readings for daily and Sunday liturgies along with daily Scriptural reflections for each day. DO TAKE ONE!!
- > A variety of **devotional books** containing Advent meditations are available for your taking along with some Advent coloring books. DO TAKE ONE!!
