On mission (Mission Sunday)

94 years ago (October 1927) the first world-wide Mission Sunday collection was taken up by Catholics throughout the whole world. This Sunday (October 24th) will be this year's Mission Sunday Collection.

The money collected supports almost 1200 dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific islands, and remote regions in Latin America and is distributed by the Church's Society for the Propagation of the Faith. All of this is in keeping with what is known as Christ's 'Great Commission' as he ascended into heaven and said, "Go, therefore, teach all nation baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit." [Mt. 28:19]

The needs of these mission dioceses are vast and calls forth the resources of all Catholics to help our brothers and sisters who yearn for the 'Good News' and the gifts of Gospel living. Through the missionary works of priests and religious communities the Gospel is being proclaimed, chapels/churches and orphanages are being built, dioceses are being formed, seminaries are opening, catechetical resources are being dispersed often in lands that have long suppressed the Christian faith.

From the time of Christ to this day the Church is on mission to the whole world. That is the very meaning of the word – catholic, i.e, to be universal, to take the Gospel to all parts of the world, to share the gift of salvation with all people. All of us are called to be missionaries. By our support of the Mission Sunday collection we become 'co-missionaries' with those on the front lines of bringing Christ to the nations.
