# **PASTOR'S NOTES**

### Different, but deeply connected, days

On November  $1^{st}$  and November  $2^{nd}$  the Church celebrates two different, but very deeply connected, realities in our lives of faith.

Both of these days remind us that death will come to all of us. What happens at death is not the same for everyone. At the very moment of death a particular judgement will be rendered on each person's life. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches:

- (1) "Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are <u>perfectly purified</u> live forever with Christ" in **heaven** (CCC 1023);
- (2) "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still <u>imperfectly purified</u>" (CCC 1030) undergo purification in **Purgatory** so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven [Rev. 21:27];
- (3) For those who "die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love ... remaining separated from him forever by our own free choice. This state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called **hell** ." (CCC 1033)

November 1<sup>st</sup> celebrates All Saints Day, which is one of the five Holy Days in the United States (the other 4 being: Japuary 1<sup>st</sup> - Mary, Mother of God; August 15<sup>th</sup> - Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven; December 8<sup>th</sup> - Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary; December 25<sup>th</sup> - Christmas). On the church calendar many days are designated as days of particular saints (e.g. - October 4<sup>th</sup> - <u>St. Francis of Assisi</u>; November 10<sup>th</sup> - <u>St. Leo the Great</u>; July 5<sup>th</sup> - <u>St. Thomas the Apostle</u>, etc.). But All Saints Day acknowledges there are many more saints than those officially recognized or listed on the church calendar (*i.e.* - possibly deceased family and friends). On November 1<sup>st</sup> we celebrate and seek the intercession of all holy men and women who live in heaven surrounded by and immersed in the blessedness of God.

On the other hand, **November 2<sup>nd</sup> (All Souls Day)** is a day set aside for us to pray for deceased loved ones undergoing the purification of Purgatory. It is our offering of Masses, prayers and almsgiving that assist them in being purified from their vestiges of sin and help them attain their final glory of heavenly life and the beatific vision of God. These offerings of Masses, prayers and almsgiving are often called – **'suffrages'**.


Both of these days (*November 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>*) acknowledge what the Apostles' Creed calls the 'communion of saints', which is another name for the Church. **The Church is comprised of three states of being: (1) we, the living on earth; (2) the saints in heaven; (3) the souls in purgatory.** Because the Church is One there is a sharing of spiritual goods among these three states of the Church. We seek the intercession of those already in heaven (the saints) while they are always praying for us, and we offer prayers and alms for loved ones in purgatory who are constantly seeking/desiring our spiritual help. The Church as the 'communion of saints' is both a communion among holy persons and a sharing of holy things among holy persons.

**Masses for All Saints Day,** which is a Holy Day, will be at St. Thomas in Buffalo on <u>Sunday, October</u> <u> $31^{st}$  at 4:30 p.m.</u> and at St. Leo's in Casselton on <u>Monday, November 1<sup>st</sup> at 7 p.m.</u>

On All Souls Day {November 2<sup>nd</sup>) there will be 9 a.m. daily Mass at St. Thomas. St. Leo's will host an Evening Prayer Remembrance Service at 7 p.m. All who have lost a loved one – *this year or in years gone by* – are invited to attend this Evening Prayer Remembrance Service. Praying for the living and the dead is a spiritual work of mercy. The service will be followed by a simple reception in the Spirit of Life Center.
