PASTOR'S NOTES

All Saints Day/All Souls Day — different, but connected

Every November 1st and 2nd the Church celebrates <u>All Saints Day</u> $\{Nov. 2^{nd}\}$ followed by <u>All Souls Day</u> $\{Nov. 2^{nd}\}$. At the heart of these two day stands the reality of death, which begs the questions -

What happens at death? At the very moment of death a particular judgement will be rendered on each person's life because death ends our freedom to accept or reject Christ. At death our destinies may differ - the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches:

- (1) "Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are <u>perfectly purified</u> live forever with Christ" in **heaven** [CCC 1023];
- (2) For those who "die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love ... remaining separated from him forever by our own free choice. This state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called **hell.**" [CCC 1033];
- (3) "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still <u>imperfectly purified</u>" [CCC 1030] undergo purification in **Purgatory** so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven [Rev. 21:27]

Tuesday, November 1st **celebrates All Saints Day**. This day is one of five Holy Days in the life of the Church and acknowledges there are many more saints than those officially recognized or listed on the church calendar (*i.e. - possibly deceased family and friends*). On November 1st we celebrate and seek the intercession of all holy men and women who live in heaven surrounded by and immersed in the blessedness of God.

Masses for All Saints Day, which is a Holy Day, will be at St. Thomas in Buffalo on Monday, October 31st at 5:30 p.m. and at St. Leo's in Casselton on Tuesday November 1st at 7 p.m.

Wednesday, November 2nd celebrates All Souls Day. This day is set aside for us to pray for deceased loved ones undergoing the purification of Purgatory. At death many spiritual lives may need to be purified for **not** having done their 'level best' to —

~ build their house on rock; ~ provide good soil for the seed of God's Word; ~ render on to God the things that are God's; ~ sell all that they had for the 'pearl of great price'; ~ take up their Cross and follow Christ; ~ give God his share of the harvest; ~ love God with all their hearts, mind and strength; ~ etc.;

It is our offering of Masses, prayers and almsgiving that assist them in being purified from their vestiges of sin and help them attain their final glory of heavenly life and the beatific vision of God.

On **All Souls Day {November 2nd}** there will be 10:30 a.m. funeral Mass at St. Leo's. At 7 p.m. St. Leo's will host an <u>Evening Prayer Remembrance Service</u>. All who have lost a loved one – *this year or in years gone by* — are invited to attend this Evening Prayer Remembrance Service. Praying for the living and the dead is a spiritual work of mercy. The service will be followed by a simple reception in the Spirit of Life Center.

Book of REMEMBRANCE

After the All Saints Day liturgy, a book titled Book of Remembrance can be found at the church entrance. Parishioners are invited to write the names of <u>deceased</u> loved ones in that book. During the month of November and lasting until the end of this church year the names in that book will be remembered at the Masses offered at St. Leo's and St. Thomas. Our last Mass for this church year will be Friday, November 25th.
