PASTOR'S NOTES

War-torn Gaza

Since October 7, 2023 there has been an armed conflict in the Gaza Strip between Israel and Hamas and other Palestinian militant groups. That surprise attack by Hamas killed 1195 Israeli and foreign nationals along with hostages being taken captive.

In these ensuing two years thousands of Palestinians have been killed and injured. The people of this region including Catholics and other Christian groups have suffered immensely from the lack of food and basic necessities to survive.

Archbishop Timothy Broglio, who is the President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops [USCCB], has asked all bishops in the United States to take up a special collection for our brothers and sisters suffering tremendous human plight in Gaza. This is not meant to be construed as taking sides in this military conflict but to provide the most basic necessities of life (e.g. - food). As Archbishop Broglio writes:

"Our Church mourns the terrible suffering of Christians and other innocent victims of violence in Gaza and surrounding areas who are struggling to survive, protect their children, and live with dignity in dire conditions. The Holy Father continues to call for a cease fire and for aid to enter the territory, noting with great sorrow that "Gaza is starving". Please consider a donation that will be used by our international Catholic organizations Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) and Catholic Relief Services (CRS) that are working to provide food, shelter, and care."

At our recent Presbyterate Days in Valley City, Bishop Folda said the Catholic Patriarch of Jerusalem is deeply respected by all sides in this matter and the aid that is given will get to the people in this time of great need. There are envelopes attached to your bulletin for your support.
