## 'Troubles' in your marriage?? —

A retrouvaille weekend is specifically oriented to marriages that are going through troubled **times.** It its meant to help married couples who are struggling to communicate, who are struggling to stay together, who are cold and distant from one another, or who are separated or divorced, but want to try again. It is not a sensitivity group, a seminar, social gathering nor a spiritual retreat. The weekend is organized around helping each couple listen to couples who themselves have experienced marital difficulties and ways in which they have 'rediscovered' communication patterns and gained insights about themselves as individuals and as a couple. After each presentation each couple takes some personal private time to reflect and write about what has been presented and then in turn discuss their writings with their spouse.

Research shows that couples in happy marriages live longer, have greater wealth, and enjoy a better standard of living with their children being happier, healthier, more secure and who do better in school.
