PASTOR'S NOTES

A Labor Day — a spiritual note —

As is often the case, we enter into holidays and many times give little heed to the meaning and purpose of the days 'we get off from work'. The late Pope John Paul II (now St. John Paul II) issued an encyclical letter titled Laborem Exercens on September 14, 1981 and its purpose was to offer a reflection "On Human Work". The overall theme of Laborem Exercens was the transcendent dignity of work. Work always must be evaluated through the meaning it has in the eyes of God and how it collaborates in the redemption of the human race and the development of the Kingdom of heaven.

We often think of work in terms of the things that work produces or the profits we make from our work. *Laborem Exercens* talks about these things, but more importantly directs us to look at work from the perspective of the worker and what work means for the worker.

When work is examined from the perspective of the worker a number of principles become clear. Because of the transcendent dignity of the human person: (1) labor has priority over capital; (2) the right to private property is subordinate to the right of common use, due to the fact that goods are meant for everyone; (3) property should be of service to the person; (4) the rights of workers.

As we take a "day off work", we are really called to celebrate the dignity of work by which we earn our daily bread, but more importantly the ways by which we bring about greater justice, a wider brotherhood/sisterhood, and the more human ordering of social relationships. Every now and then it is important to take a break and meditate upon the fundamental dimensions/activities of our lives so as to gain a renewed perspective on things.

Holy Land Collection

Usually the world-wide Good Friday collection supports the work of the Franciscans in the Holy Land – **the very place Jesus lived and died.** Because of COVID-19 the 2020 collection was transferred to Sunday, September 13th, which is the day nearest the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross (September 14th). On this feast the Church deeply reveres the Cross upon which hung the Savior of the world and who rose from the dead on the third day (Easter).

It is sites like these (*Calvary and the Holy Sepulcher*) plus over 50 other shrines connected to the life of Christ and the prophets that the Franciscans oversee, preserve and keep 'alive' for all who visit the Holy Land.

Besides overseeing the shrines of the Holy Land the Holy Land collections supports parishes, schools, orphanages, seminary formation for over 100 priests and brothers, etc. throughout the whole of the Holy Land.

The Christians who live there are the descendants of those who first believed in Christ and lived the Christian faith. Much of their livelihood depends on visitors. As you can well imagine COVID-19 has deeply disrupted their lives. In addition, these Christians suffer greatly from the vicissitudes of being in the Middle East with its constant warfare, never-ending violence, and the instability of the region.

The Holy Land collection supports the Franciscans in their unique responsibility of caring for the Holy Places as well as for the 'Living Stones' (today's Christians) living in the land trod by Jesus and the prophets.

The Holy Land envelopes were in your regular April packet of envelopes for Good Friday. Perhaps that envelope got lost. There will be envelopes in the pews and the back of the church for your use. **Your support is deeply appreciated.**
