

PASTOR’S NOTES

The Pandemic – a Papal response

On Friday, March 27th at noon local time and 6 p.m. Rome time Pope Francis gave an extraordinary blessing of the Blessed Sacrament ‘to the city and to the world’. In Latin this kind of blessing is called ‘urbi et orbi’ {to the city and to the world} and is usually more simple and only given at the election of a pope and at Christmas and Easter. But these are extraordinary times calling for extraordinary measures.

This was a Holy Hour held at the entrance of St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome to an empty, rain-drenched St. Peter’s square. This was a Holy Hour for the world and was live-streamed.

In this hour of prayer the Gospel passage of Jesus calming the sea while the disciples were in a boat being tossed about by the wild waters of the Sea of Galilee was proclaimed. Pope Francis saw this Gospel passage as an apt description of our times - **the world being tossed by the coronavirus!**

In addition to the silent prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament Pope Francis spoke some words to the world about this pandemic. He also prayed for God to see how people are suffering and to give us comfort. More specifically he sought God’s care for the sick and dying, for exhausted medical workers giving their all in the care of those in need and for political leaders and their policy decisions for protecting people.

Addressing the pandemic itself Pope Francis said this is “**not God’s judgement on humanity, but God’s call on people to judge what is most important to them and resolve to act accordingly from now on.**”

He went on to say this pandemic has exposed “our vulnerability and uncovers those false and superfluous certainties around which we have constructed our daily schedules, our projects, our habits and priorities.”

He stated the Lord loves this world more than we do, but “we have gone ahead with breakneck speed, feeling powerful and able to do anything. Greedy for profit, we let ourselves get caught up in things and be lured away by haste. We did not stop at your (God’s) reproach to us, we were not shaken awake by wars or injustice across the world, nor did we listen to the cry of the poor or of our ailing planet. We carried on regardless, thinking we would stay healthy in a world that was sick.”

In this analysis Pope Francis sees the turbulent waters of our times, which is tossing the boat carrying humanity through this time in history. We have been caught off guard and find ourselves afraid and lost. We need to invite Christ “**into the boats of our lives (and) let us hand over our fears to him so that he can conquer them**” as Christ calmed the sea of Galilee for his disciples.

In that spirit he ended the Holy Hour by raising the monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament and blessed ‘the city and the world’ (*urbi et orbi*) in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Spiritual Communion ...

In these days of social distancing and the ‘closing down’ of public Masses and church events, the Church encourages us to enter into a ‘spiritual communion’ with the Lord, especially on Sunday, the Lord’s Day, when we go to church and receive Communion.

The Church has no particular formula for entering into a ‘spiritual communion’. One does this by conceiving a real desire to be united with Christ, to have him enter one’s heart and seek his blessings upon family and friends. We typically surround this desire with silent prayer, Scripture reading or devotional prayer (e.g. - the rosary).
