PASTOR'S NOTES

Highlights from —

St. Leo's Annual Parish Meeting —

Last Sunday (February 2^{nd}) St. Leo's parish had their annual parish meeting accompanied by a free pork chop and potato dinner cooked by our KC Council. A number of reports were given, a copy of which can be found at the church entry. Here are some highlights:

- > The Social Concerns Committee reported the formation of a group of parish visitors, who will keep in touch with parishioners who are homebound, in nursing homes or find themselves in assisted living/ independent living situations in surrounding communities. Last year our parish gave away a record high of \$9645 in charitable giving to 13 local, national and international organization. This does not include the \$28,000 St. Leo's tithes to our mission project in Cameroon, Africa nor the \$616 our youth gave through their Sunday Offertory giving to the Friends of Chimbote in Peru, South America.
- > Beyond the continual and unending work of straightening grave stones, St. Leo's Cemetery Committee has completed a policy booklet for St. Leo's cemetery. They are also working on establishing a site within the cemetery grounds for a baby section and are still exploring the cost, size and placement of a columbarium. A columbarium is an upright burial unit with a number of niches in which to place the remains of persons (cremains), who have decided to be cremated at the time of their deaths.
- > Our Liturgy Committee continues its strong support of providing adornments for our various church seasons, feast/holydays as well as preparing the Prayers of the Faithful for Weekend liturgies. We have been blessed with a small, but extremely dedicated group of musicians who lead us in prayer and worship. We are always looking for new musically-inclined parishioners to join our ranks!!!!
- > Our Education Committee once again reported an excellent 88% attendance rate for our RE students, but would always love to have the remaining 22 students to be with us. A big thank you to the 14 teachers who faithfully give of their time and talent to pass on our faith to our 158 attending students over the course of a school year. Last school year (2018-19) we had 52 students who had perfect attendance, which meant they did not miss any class for whatever reason. Way to go!!!
- > Our Finance Committee reported our highest Sunday Offertory collection to date of \$221,675 from 170 households. 100 households had no record of Sunday Offertory giving. 59% of Sunday Offertory giving (\$131,000) comes from households who are 60 years of age and older leaving 41% (\$91,000) coming from households younger than 60 years of age. It takes on average \$750 per household to pay the essential bills to 'keep the lights on' at St. Leo's. We are genuinely grateful for those households and whose stewardship allows us to not only pay the basic bills but also enable us to do major capital improvements (e.g. update Spirit of Life Center kitchen, replace parking lot, paint the church's interior, etc.)
- St. Leo's Knights of Columbus continue to do awesome work providing the parish and community with over 2000 volunteer hours and \$9500 in charitable contributions. Hats off to you!!!
- > Our year-old Evangelization Committee is meeting and planning ways to re-ignite the 'fires of faith' in our parish.
