PASTOR'S NOTES

A pervasive spiritual cancer —

The numbers are overwhelming and frightening!

- > It touches 40 million Americans regularly. It affects 55% of married men and 70% of unmarried ones; 25% of married women and 16% of unmarried ones; men are more than 5 ½ times more likely to be affected than women.
- >The numbers among young people are more startling 14% of boys and 9% of girls are exposed before 13 years of age; 93% of boys and 62% of girls are exposed to this cancer before 18 years of age.

What are we talking about?? PORNOGRAPHY!!

The numbers and statistics on pornography just keep rolling along. Pornography has led to a number of serious issues in our culture:

> on personal moral behaviors

56% of person aged 13-24 believe **not** recycling is more wrong than viewing pornography; only 24% of adults believe a fully nude image is pornography; 67% of young men and 49% of young women believe viewing pornography is an acceptable way to express their sexuality; 71% of teens confess they hide what they are doing online by cleaning a browser's history, lying, deleting, etc.

> in marriage and family life

trust is diminished between spouses; the hope of sexual monogamy is becoming abandoned; teaching about the gift of sexuality is being left in the hands of the porn industry; promiscuity leads to violent behaviors and abusive relationships; increased lack of attention to family and child-rearing; compulsive pornography leads to greater impairment of sexual arousal and erectile difficulties in intimate relationships; increasing belief that promiscuity is the natural state.

> on a personal level

increased risk of sexually transmitted diseases (STD) over a life time; viewing sex as a commodity and human beings as objects of pleasure; becoming numb to deviant sexual behaviors (e.g.- bestiality) and the trivialization of rape; lowering of one's perception of seeing one's spouse as attractive; creating erectile dysfunction, low libido and other sexual dysfunctions.

These numbers and consequences are staggering and devastating! It is critical that everyone, but especially parents, are aware of the dangers that lurk in our technologically-laden world. This not your 'grandfather's porn'. This stuff is available 24/7 and has the ability to "imprint" on a person's mind in ways that few other experiences do. This "imprinting" leaves us vulnerable and weakened to temptations demanding just 'another pornographic fix'. Ultimately this becomes addictive and not only self-destructive but also destructive of family, marriage, friends, etc.

The Church is committed to helping people in their struggle with pornography. On this Safe Haven Sunday and for the second year in a row we have given a booklet to our RE parents to help them raise their children by making each of our homes -- SAFE HAVENs. This year's booklet - **CONFIDENT: Helping** Parents Navigate Online Exposure – is published by Covenant Eyes (https://

www.covenanteyes.com/). We ask that you please read it and become informed so as to make your homes safe havens where the gift of sexuality is lived in the ways that God intended. The website – https:// <u>cleanheart.</u>online – is another helpful resource.
