One more week to go ...

Next Sunday (November 24th) will be the last Sunday of our current church year. The last Sunday of every church year ends with the solemnity of -- Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe -- or more simply known as Christ the King Sunday.

For the past 22 weeks our Sunday readings have been taken from the Gospel of Luke and Christ's deliberate journey to Jerusalem. This is the city of his death and resurrection. For us, Christ's journey ultimately symbolizes our journey to the heavenly city of Jerusalem. It has been a walk of discipleship. The many incidents and stories of this journey have been told so as to shape our lives of discipleship.

These stories and incidents have been a clarion call to genuine and generous love of those in need [Good Samaritan, inviting the poor and the lame]; making the spiritual life a priority [Martha and Mary]; praying rightfully and always [Lord's prayer, tax collector & publican]; being vigilant about virtuous living [Master arriving late]; being people of faith and thanksgiving [10 lepers, having faith the size of a mustard]; illusionary nature of wealth [building bigger graineries, dishonest manager, rich man & Lazarus]; coming to know God's mercy [Prodigal Son, Zacchaeus]; not just going through the 'hoops' [closed door].

On the church walls in St. Leo's we have tried to capture each week's theme of discipleship with an image from that week's Gospel story. Perhaps it would be good for us to 'visit' each of these images and review our walk of discipleship before these images are taken down for the new church year that begins with Saturday evening Mass on November 30th.
