PASTOR'S NOTES

End ... Beginning!!

Each church year ends with the Solemnity of Christ the King with the following Sunday being the First Sunday of Advent, which begins a new church year.

During each church year we travel anew through the mysteries of Christ's life and God's love for His People. Each church year is marked by various season lasting varying lengths of time: <u>Advent</u> (4 weeks); <u>Christmas</u> (2/3 weeks); <u>Lent</u> (5 weeks); <u>Holy Week/Triduum</u>; <u>Easter</u> (7 weeks); <u>Ordinary Time</u> (33/34 weeks). The Solemnity of Christ the King ends the period of time or season known as Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time we are called to live out the life of the Holy Spirit that was bestowed on history and humanity at Pentecost.

The life of faith is so deep and rich that one can never probe its fullness and treasure. The best we can do is to continually revisit what God has revealed in the life of his son, Jesus Christ, and his desire to form us in being the Body of Christ. The seasons of the church year becomes the lens by which our minds are given insight and our hearts give themselves in faith to the triumph and glory of what God has done for us in Christ Jesus.

In (Advent) our hearts and minds are prepared for God's coming in flesh and blood (Christmas). The love of God enters death on our behalf (Lent) and rises gloriously to eternal life (Easter) calling us by communion with and through the Holy Spirit to the glory and majesty of Life without end, of Truth without blemish, of Beauty without equal, of Love without limit (Ordinary Time).

With this hope in heart and mind let us prepare ourselves to enter Advent - next Sunday - praying 'O Come, O Come Emmanuel.

Thanksgiving

Every year on the fourth Thursday of November we celebrate Thanksgiving Day, and perhaps recall some history of Pilgrims and Native Americans coming together to share the fruit of the harvest. With the march of time this day and time of the year has become highly commercialized, but Thanksgiving does afford us an opportunity to review the many blessings that have come our way. As I see it, there is thanks to be given:

- > for the <u>bounty of this land and its opportunities</u> to pursue life, liberty and happiness;
- > for the gift of family and friends as we live in care and concern of others and seek the common good
- > for the gift of faith and its call to 'do what is right, love what is good and walk humbly with our God';
- > for the gift of hope that reminds us 'our citizenship is in heaven';
- > for the <u>gift of love</u> by which God reconciles the human family into a people who 'bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things and endures all things';
- > for the gift of Church as the sacrament of salvation as it gives flesh to the Gospel of Christ;
- > for the gift of eternal life and those names who will be written in the Book of Life.
